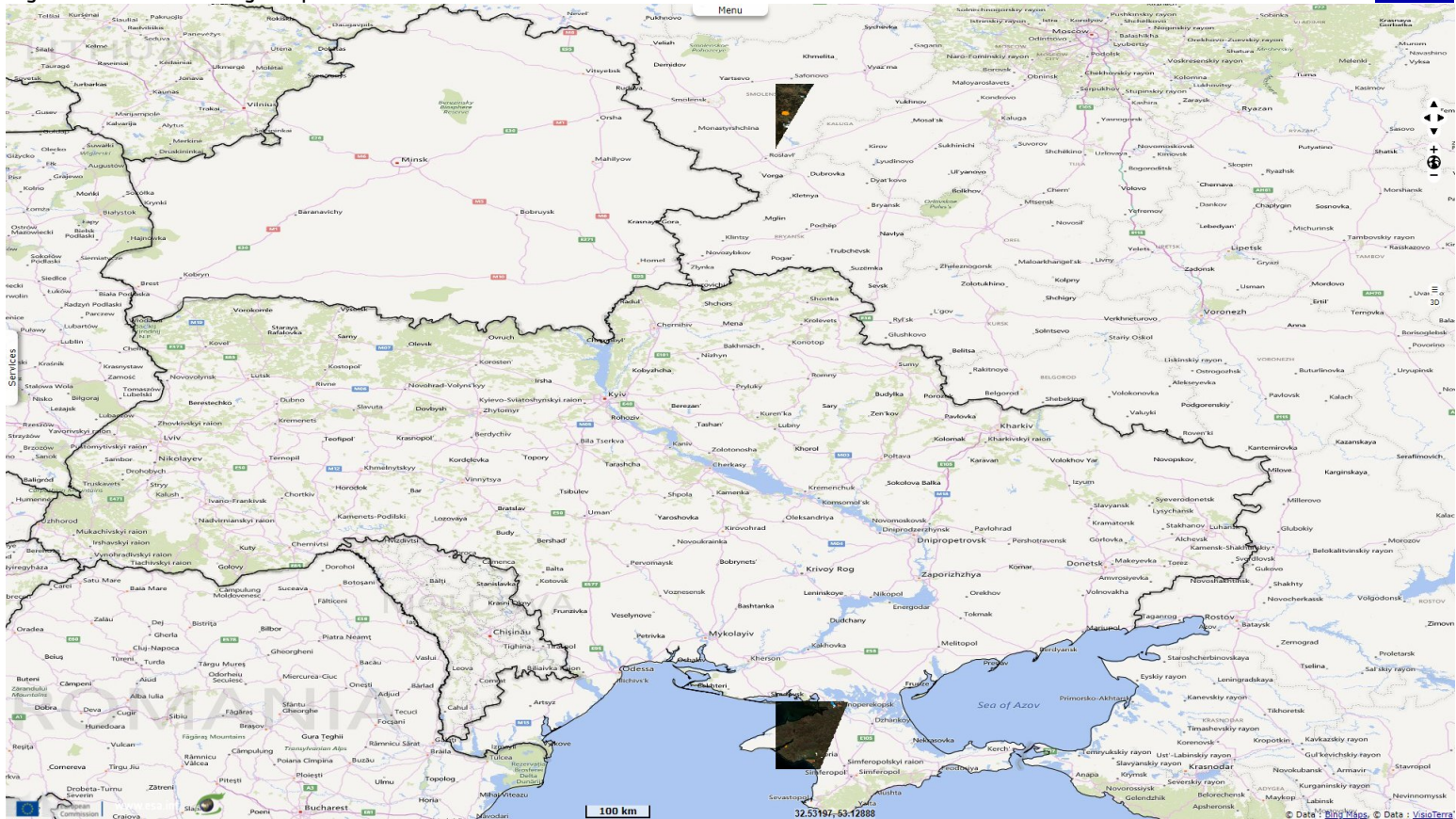


Fig. 2 - S1 [20 & 27.02.2015, 03.03.2015] - Novoozerne, in annexed Crimea, 80km away from Kiev-controlled Ukraine.

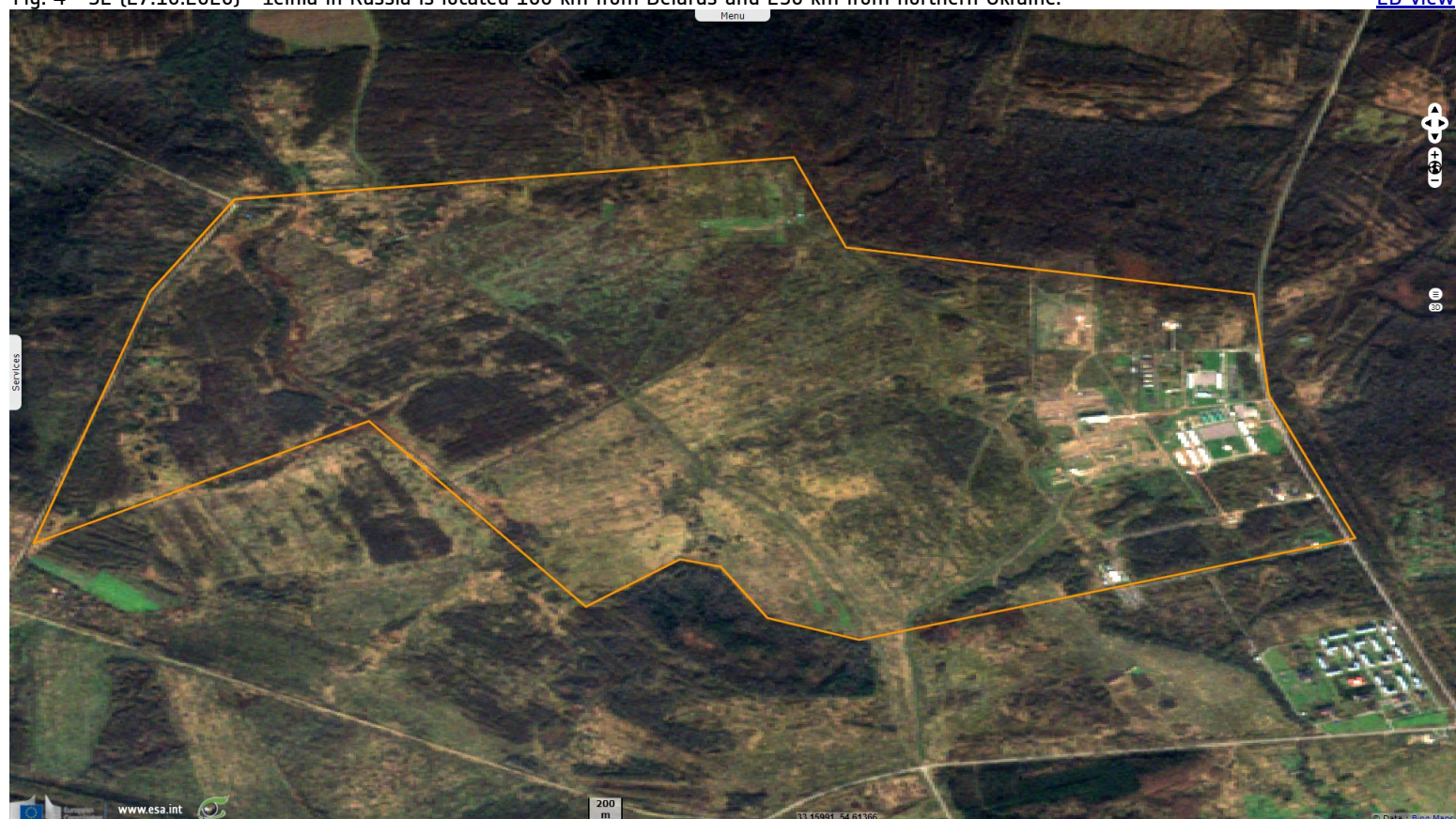


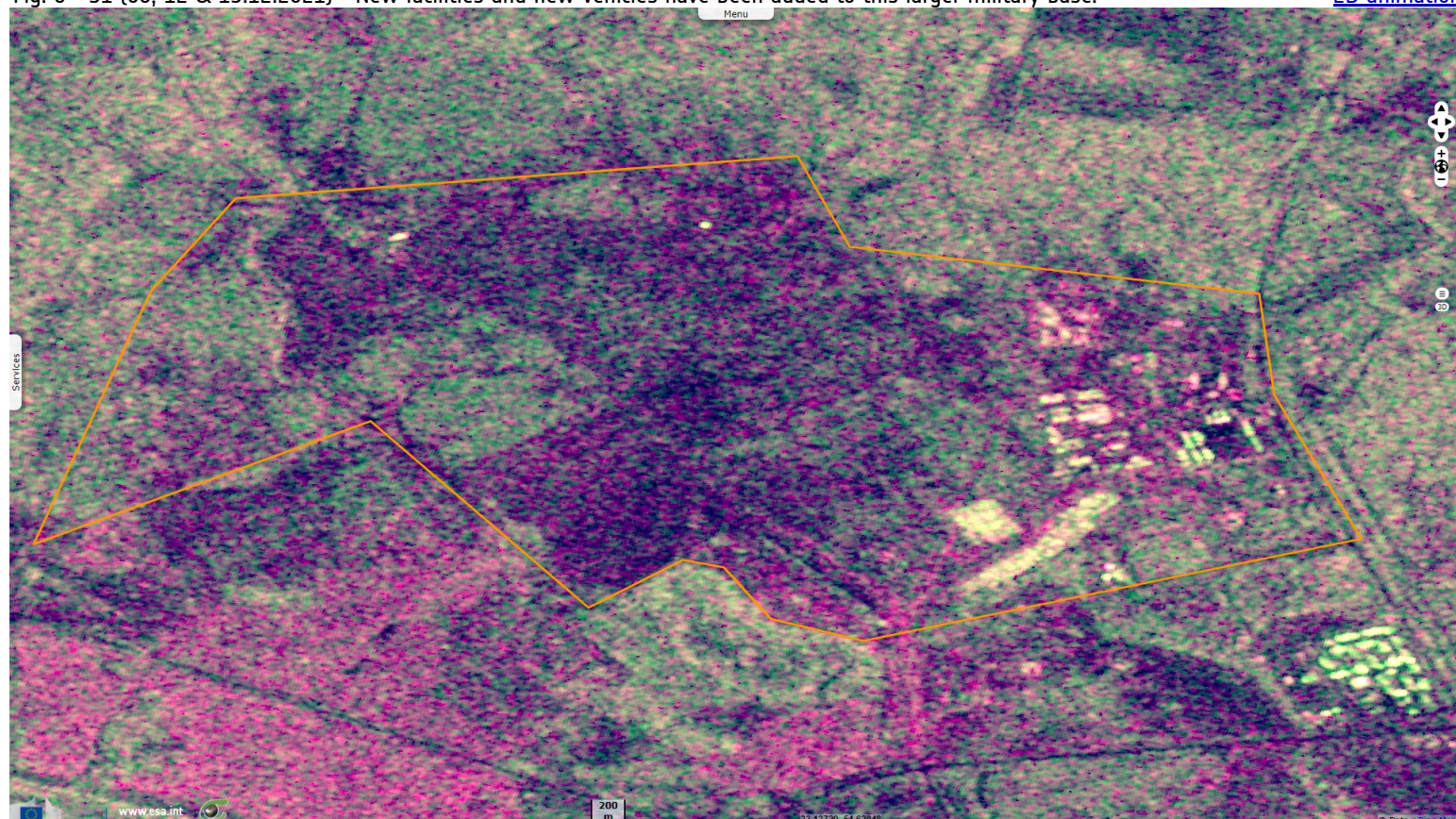
Fig. 5 - S2 (01.11.2021) - MIET's training camps have been enlarged at the end of 2021.
