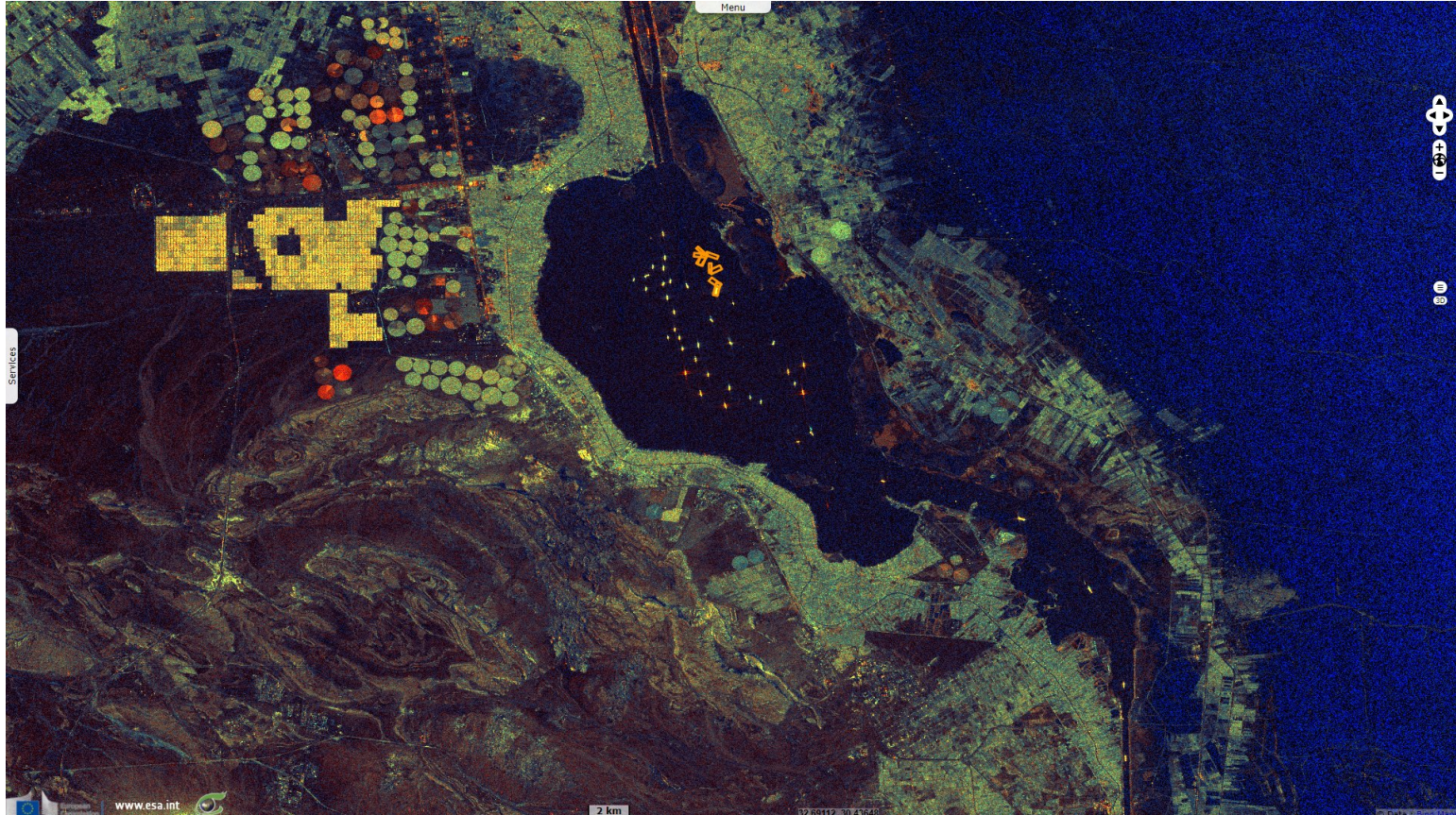


Fig. 2 - S1 (30.03.2021) - Canal authorities announced that the ship had been seized until the owners paid \$900 million in damages. [2D animation](#)

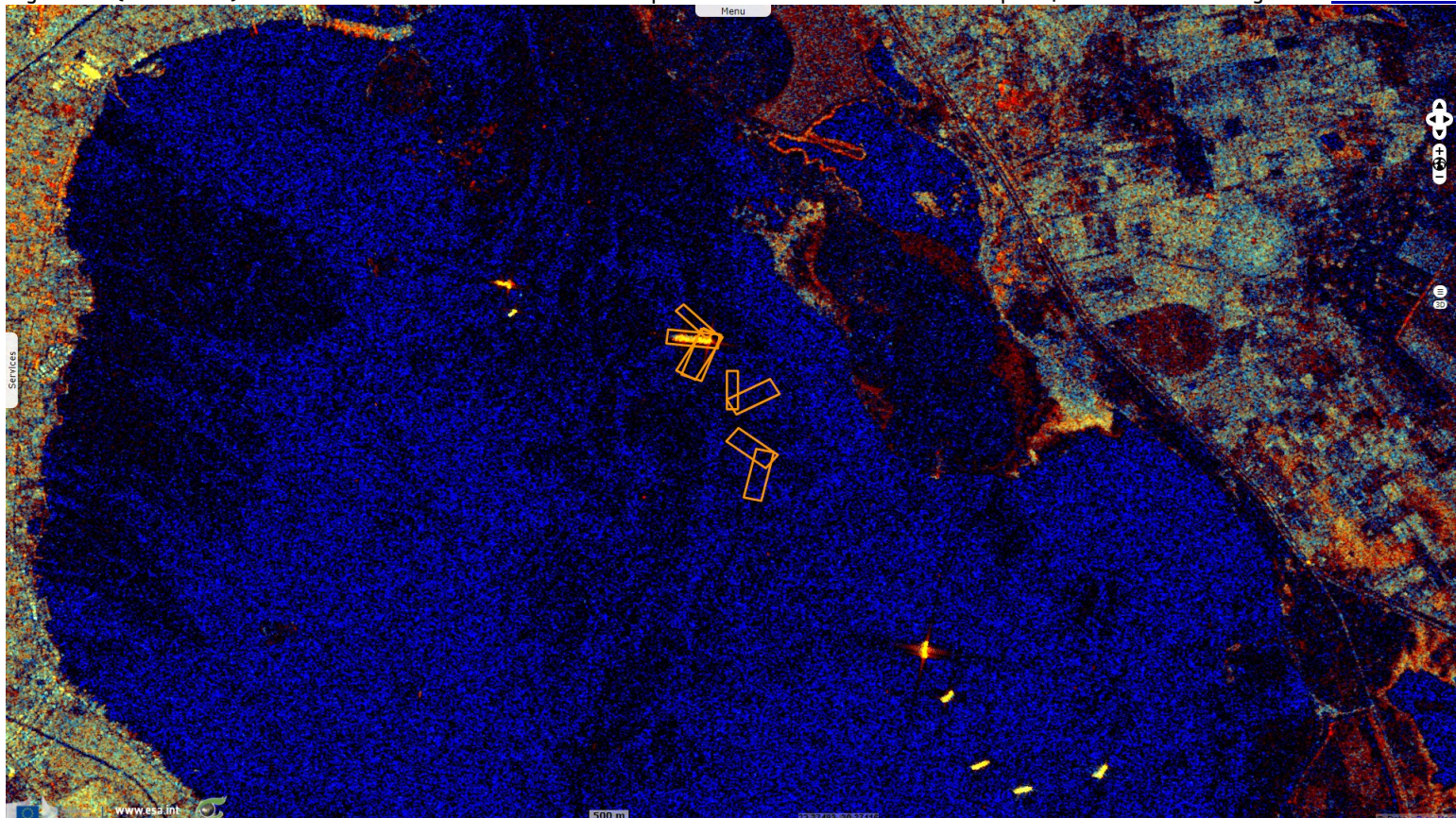




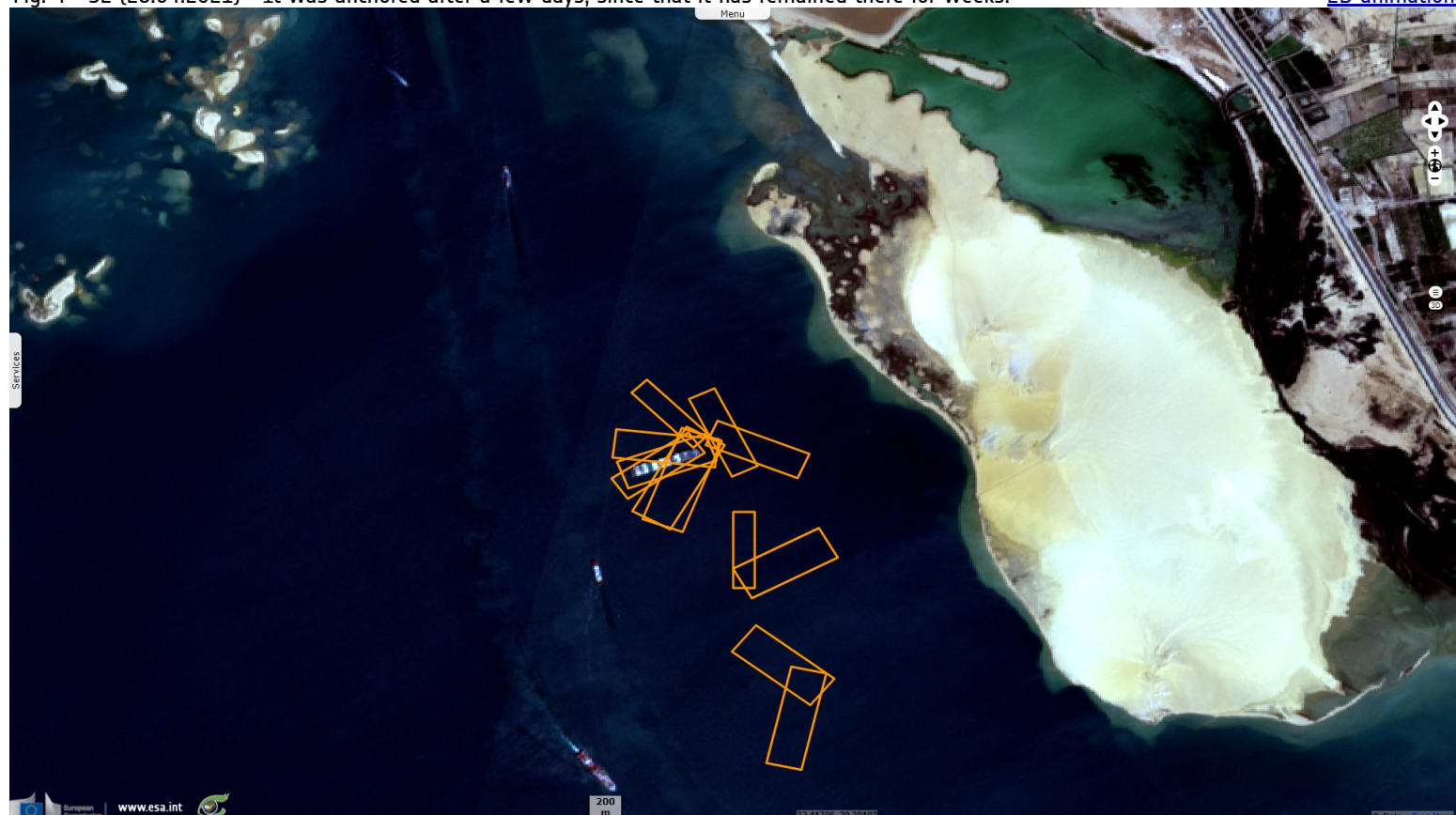
Fig. 3 - S2 (03.04.2021) - Until the fine is paid, the Ever Given has been ordered to remain in the Great Bitter Lake.
