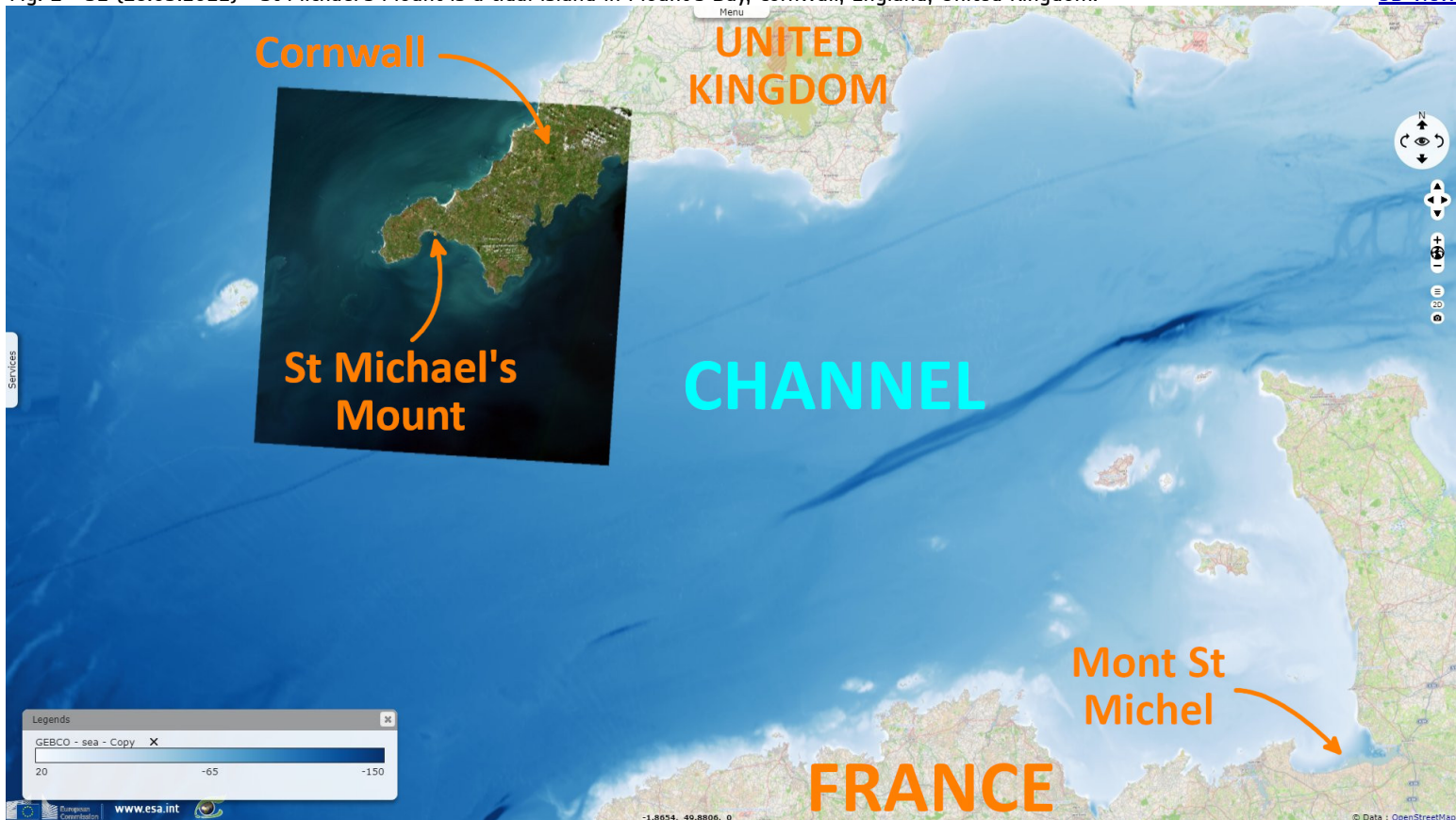
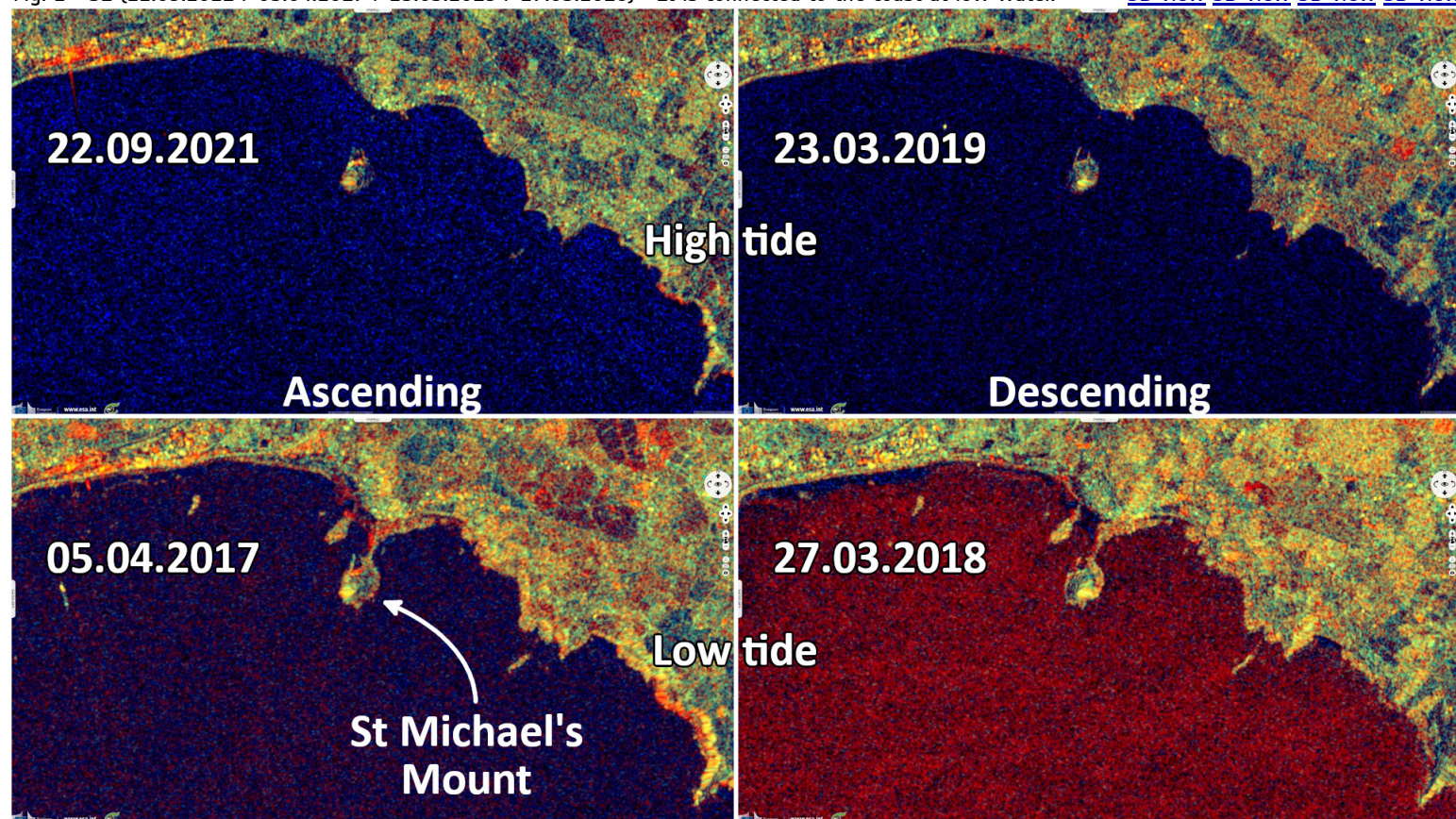


Fig. 2 - S1 (22.09.2021 / 05.04.2017 / 23.03.2019 / 27.03.2018) - It is connected to the coast at low water.

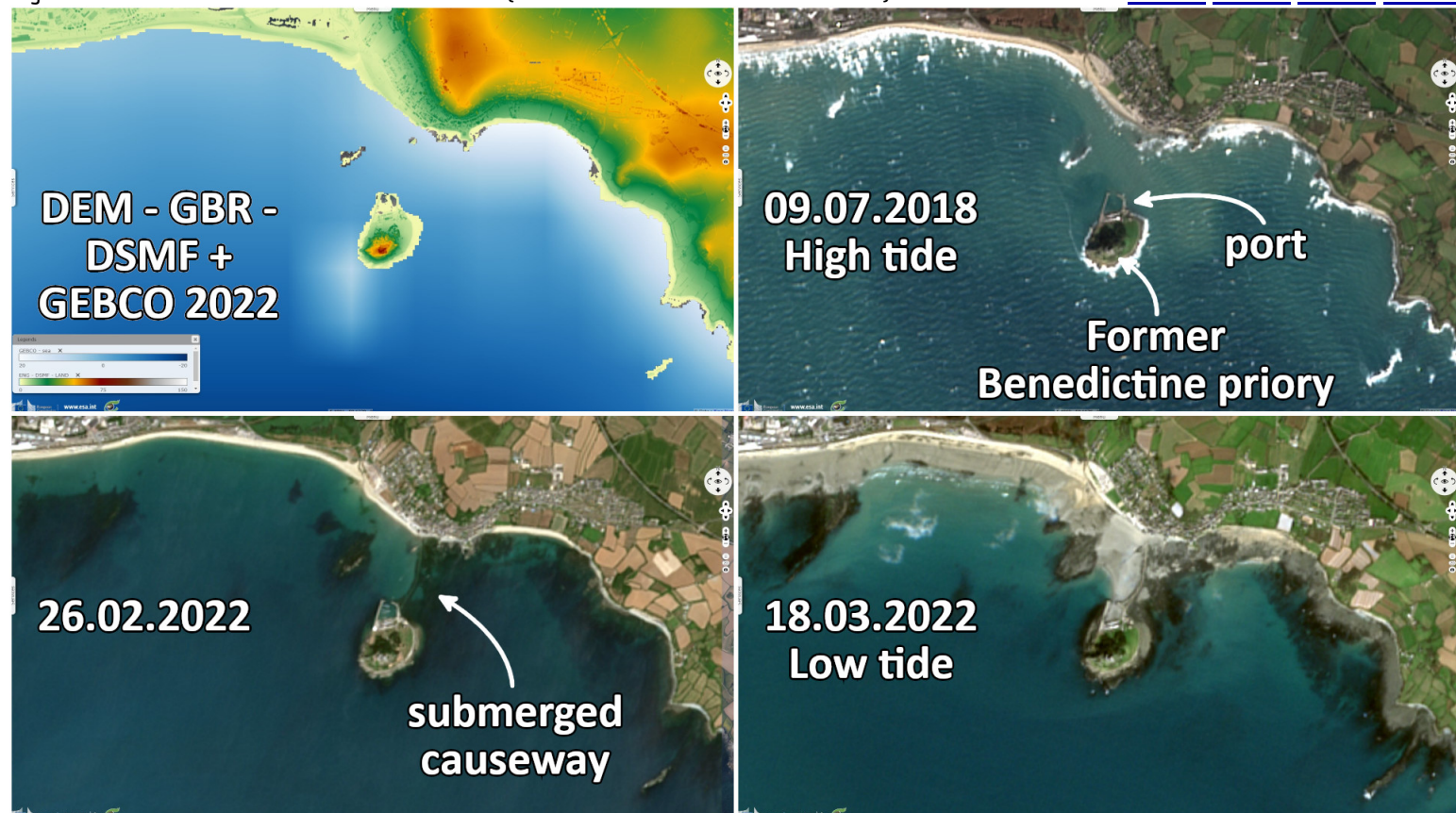
