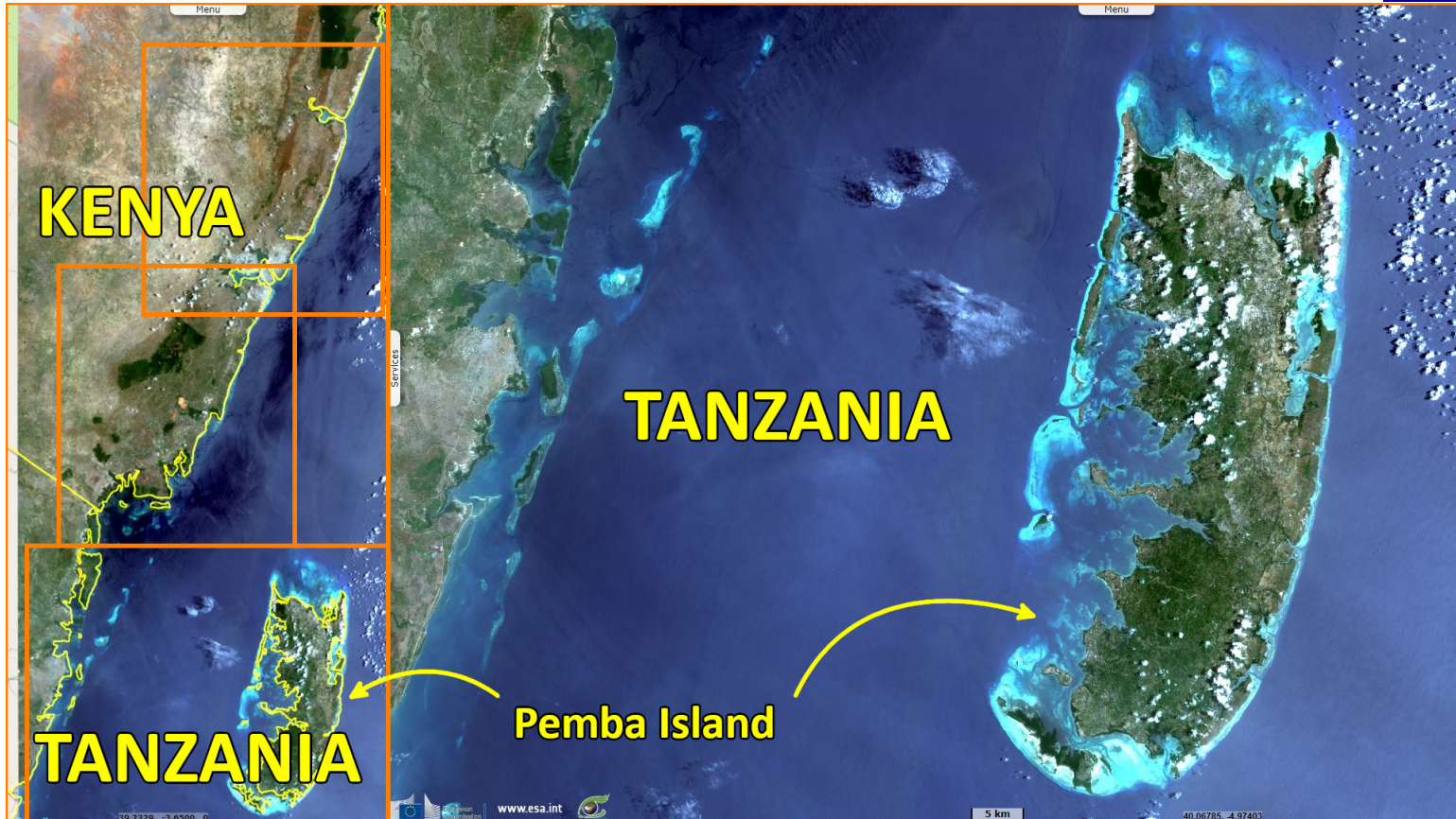
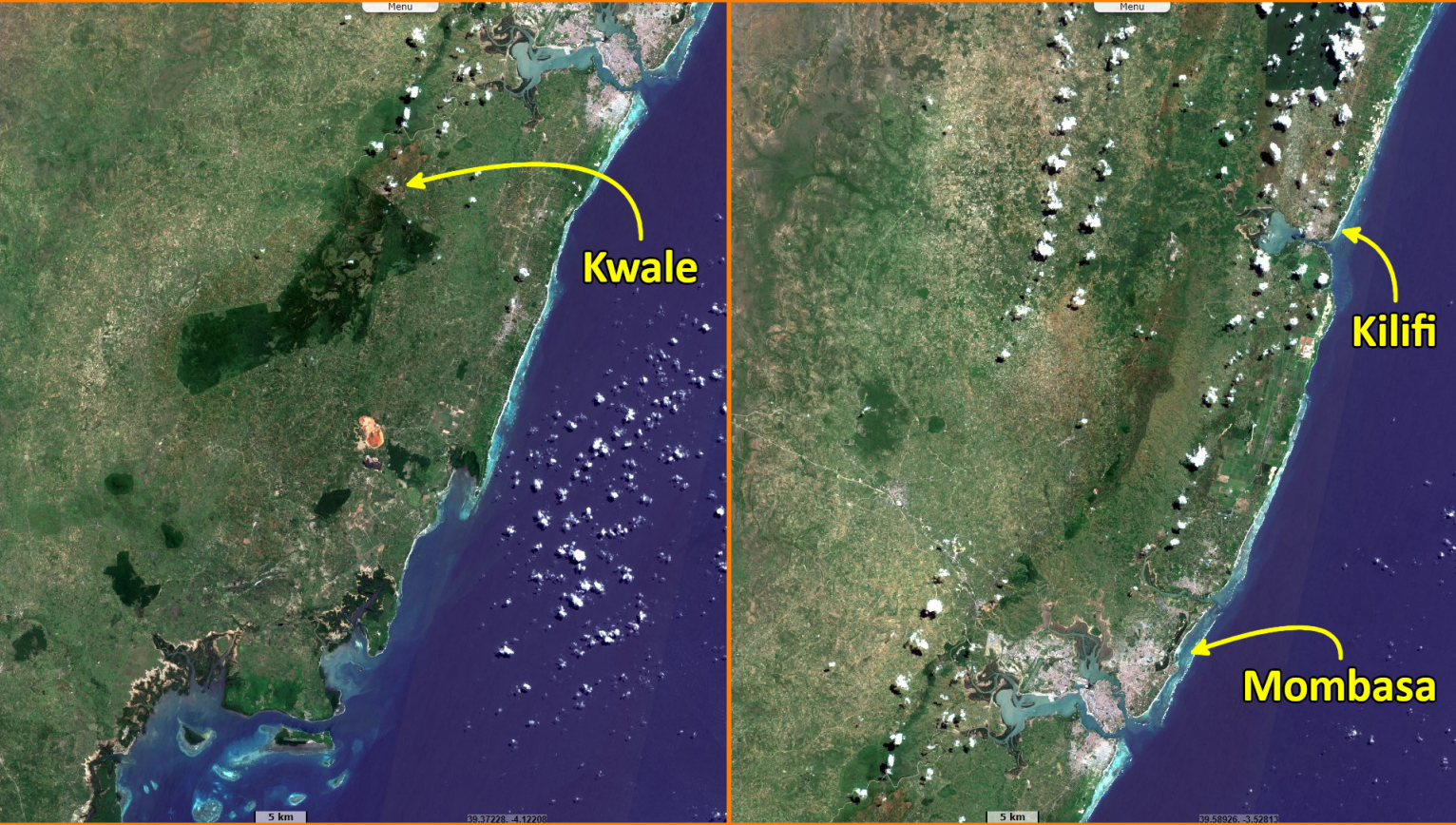


Fig. 2 - S2 (05.06.2018) - Stateless for 90 years, these ~7000 people have been recognized by the Kenyan Government.
