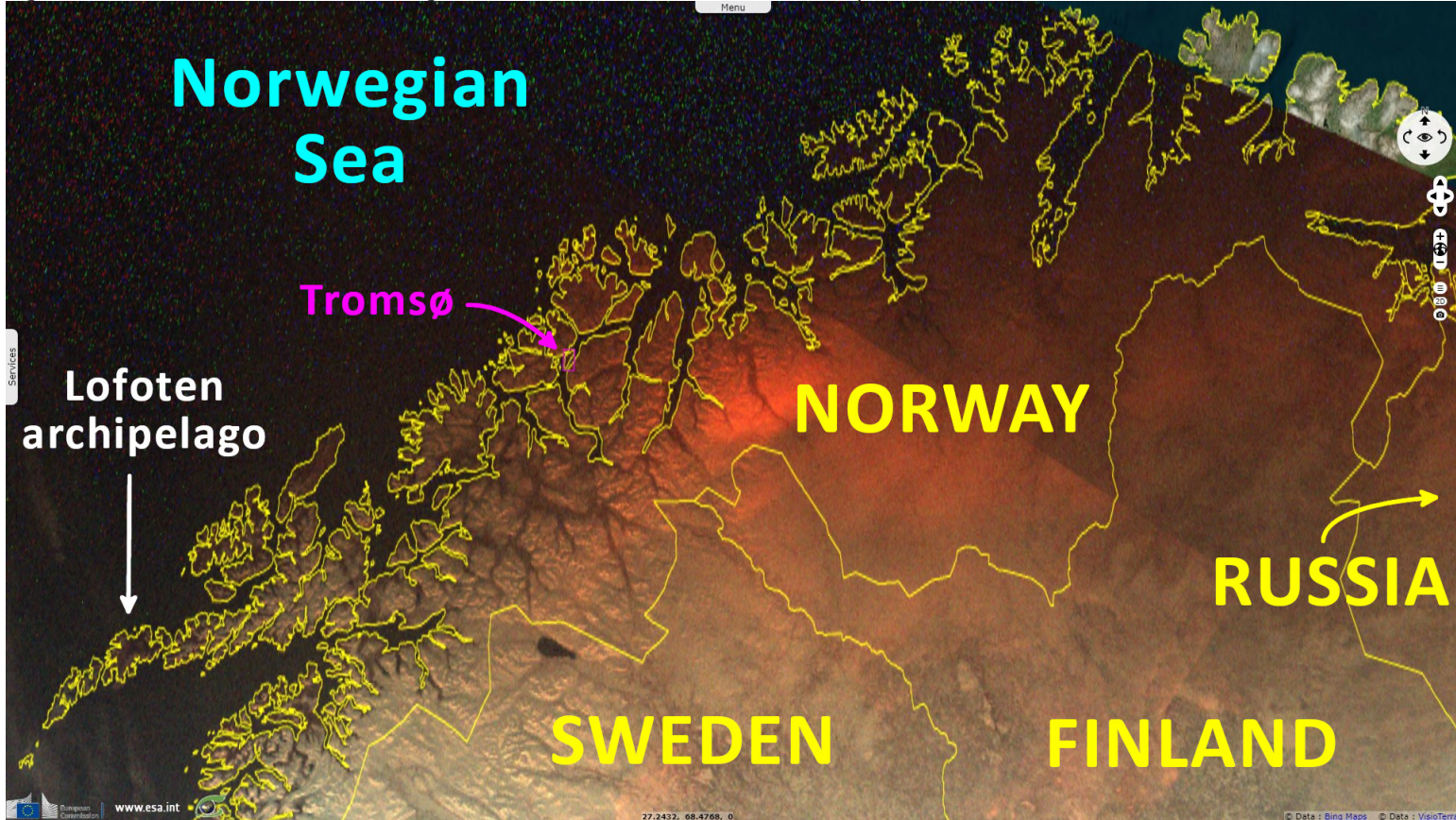
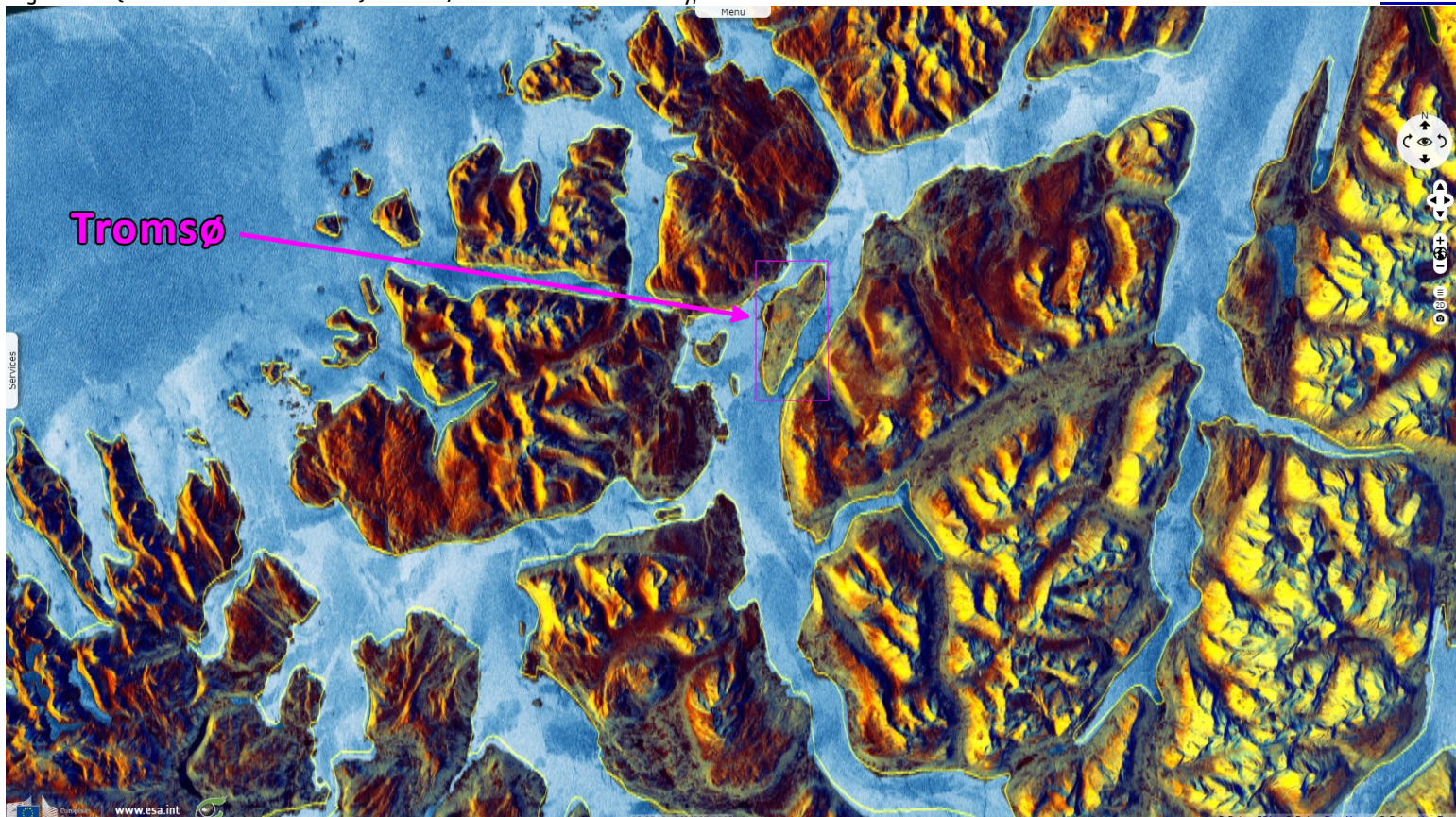


Fig. 2 - S1 (24.02.2022->06.03.2022) - Tromsø lies in Northern Norway, 300 km north of the Arctic Circle.

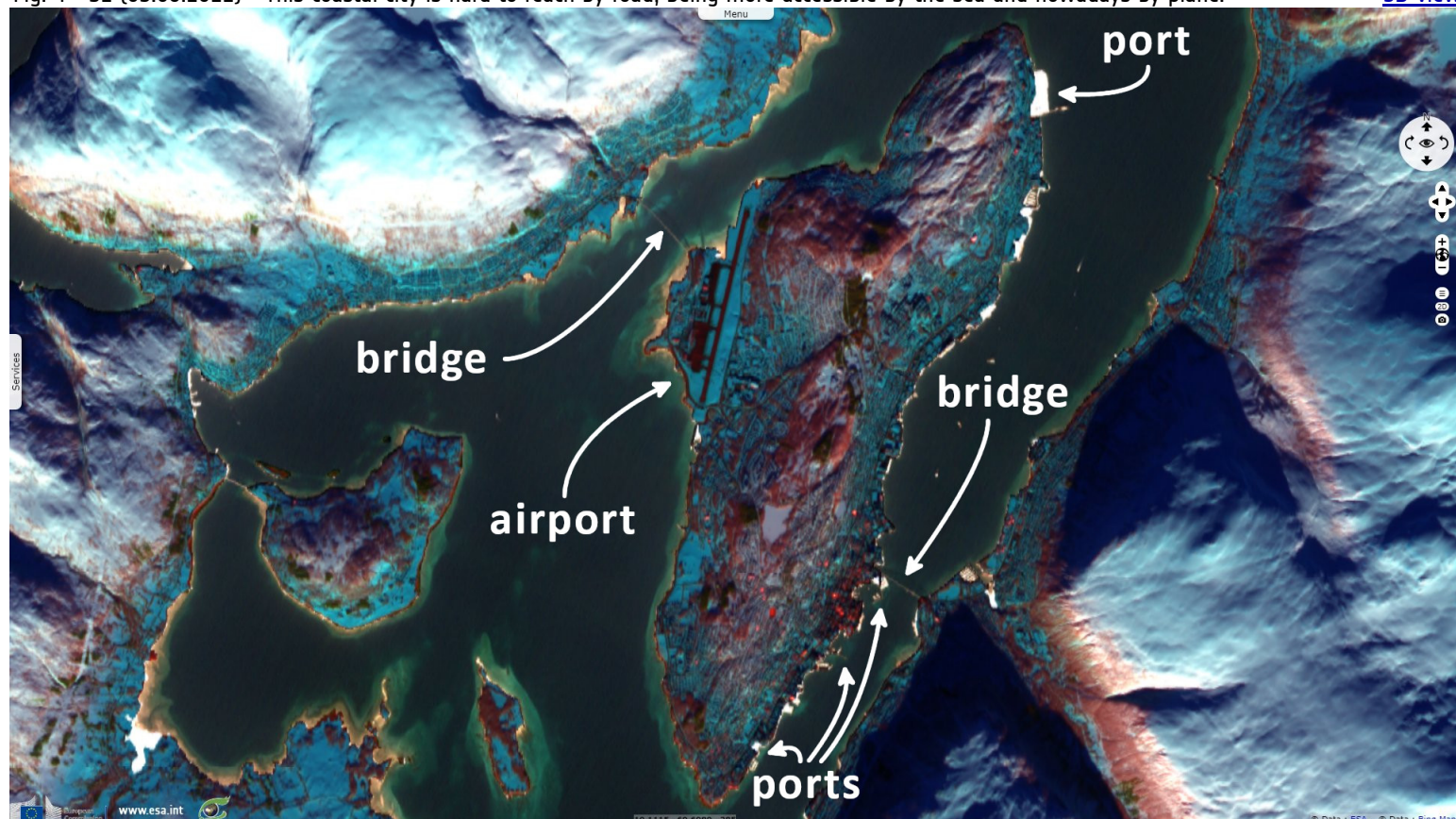


It is one of the most populous city in Norway with 65 000 inhabitants on its 21 km² island, 77 000 with nearby suburbs on nearby coastal areas.
