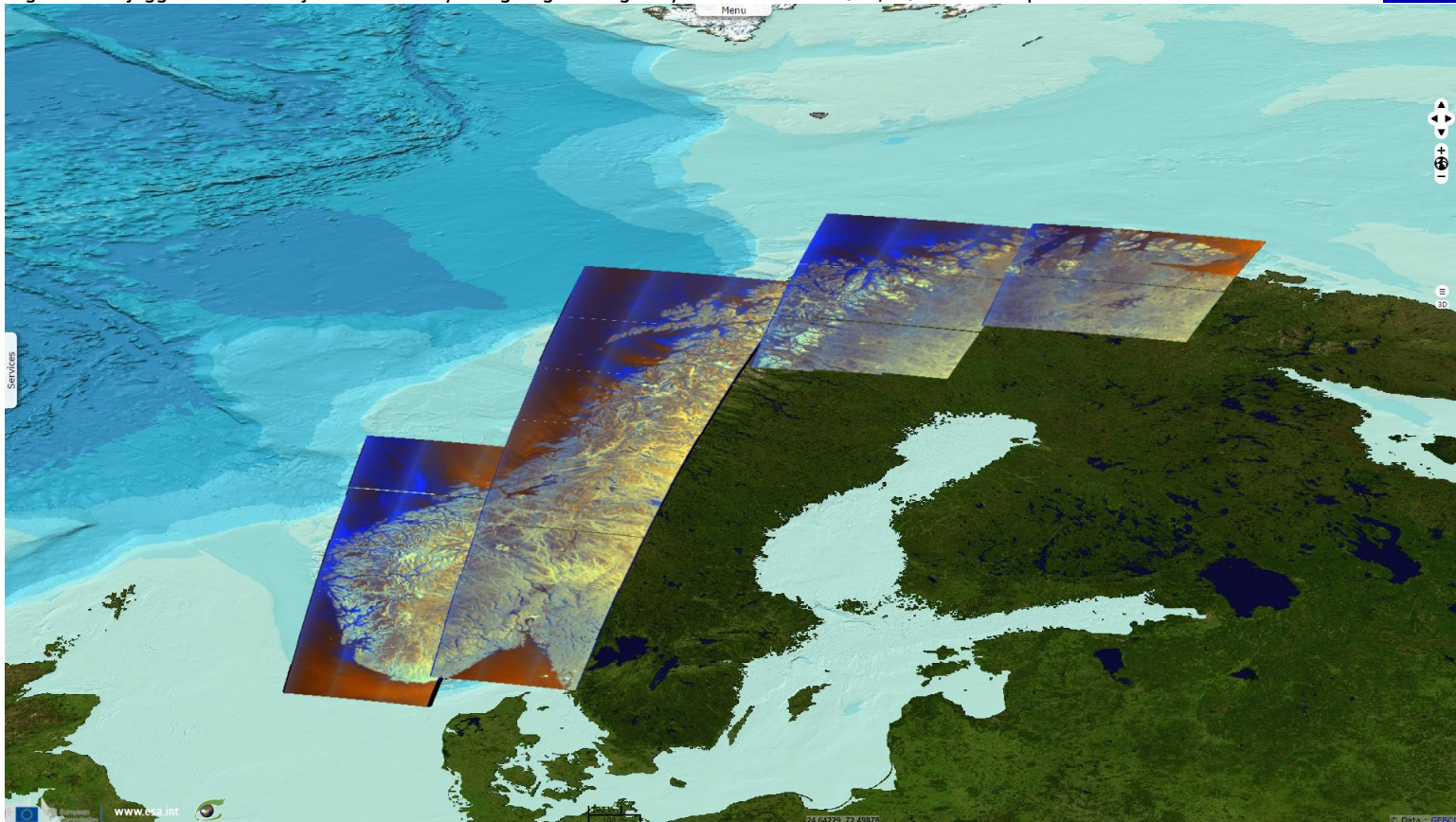
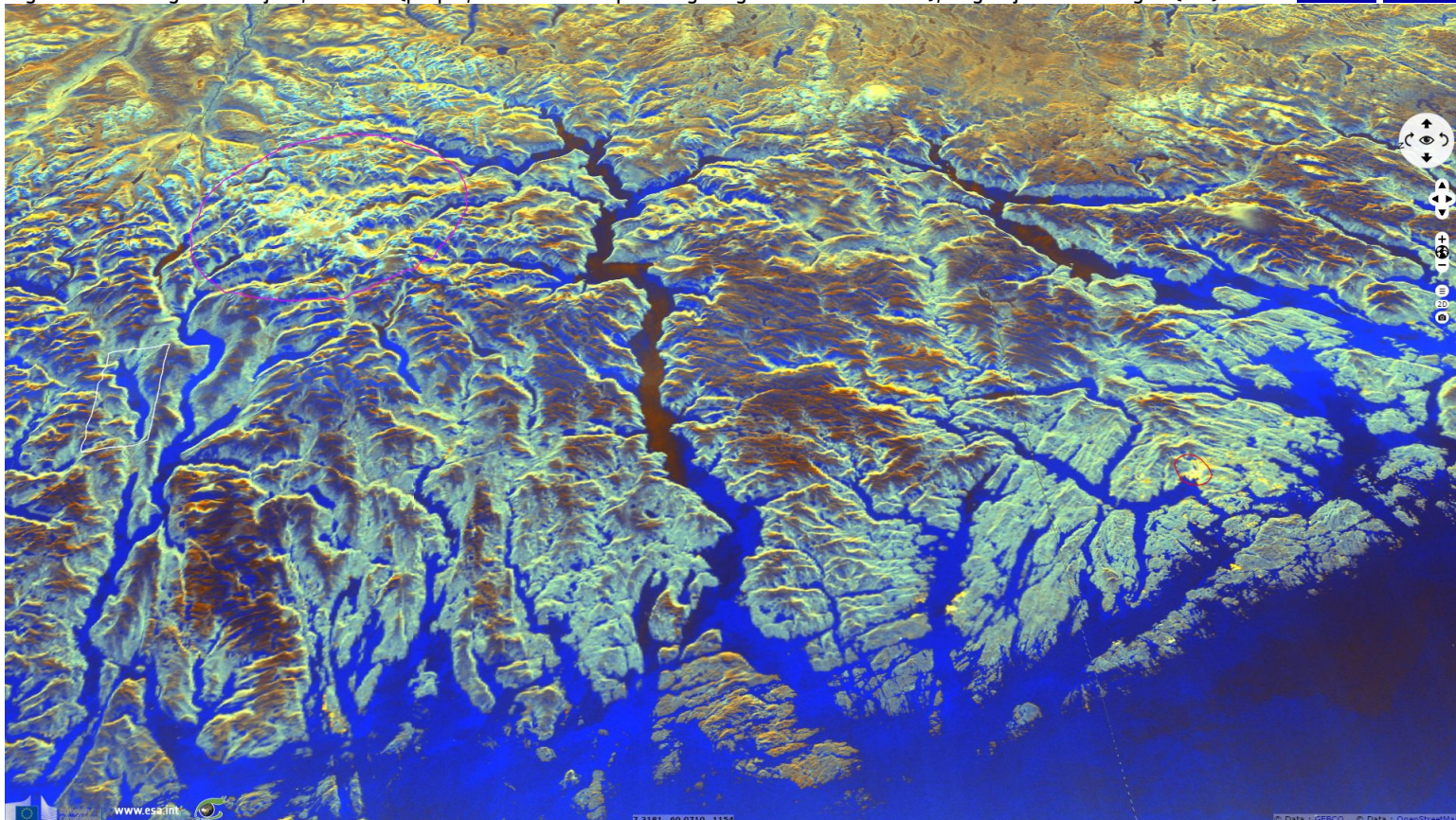


Fig. 2 - Left to right: Nordfjord, Jostedal (purple, mainland Europe's largest glacier with 487km²), Sognefjord and Bergen (red).

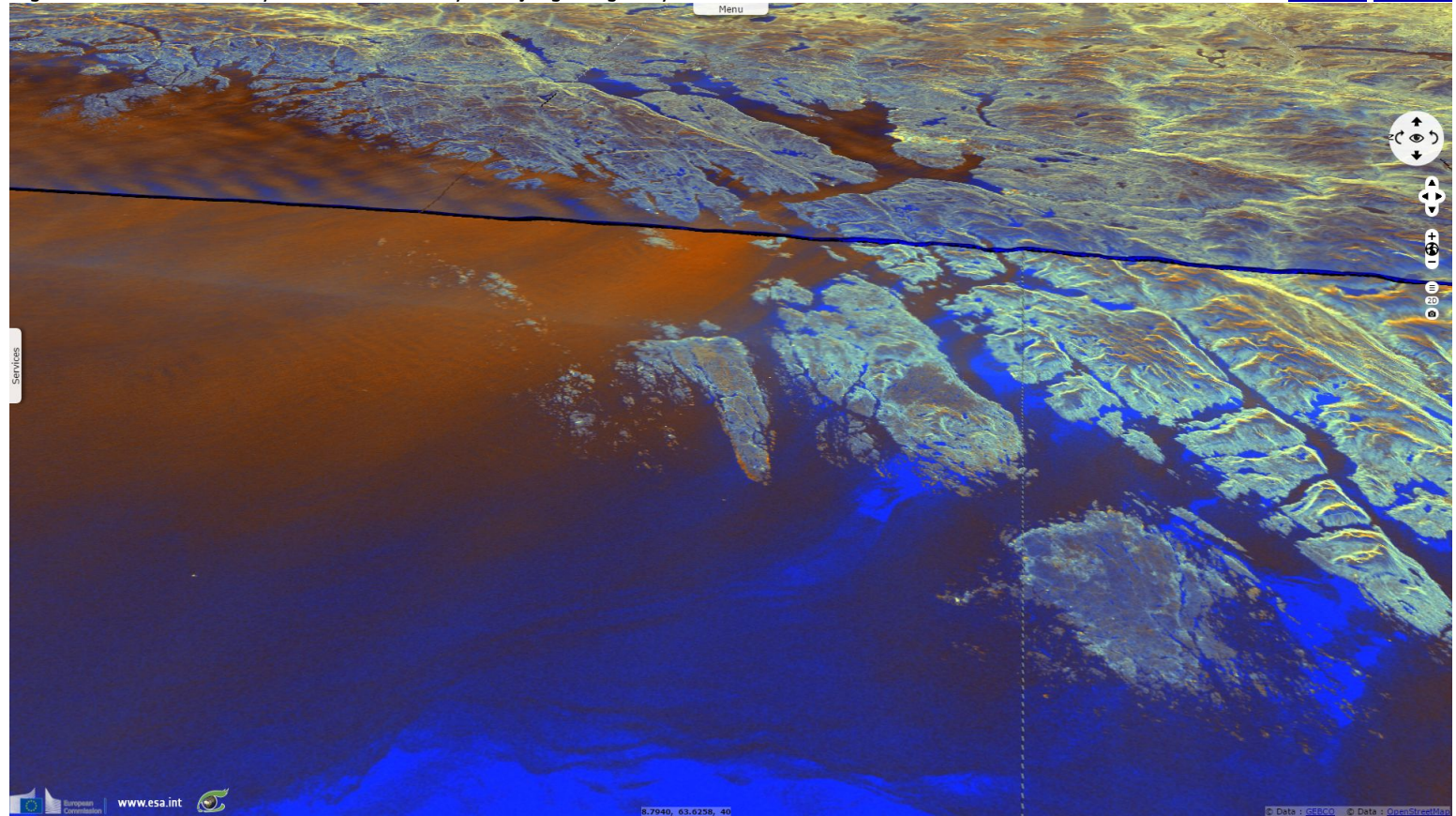
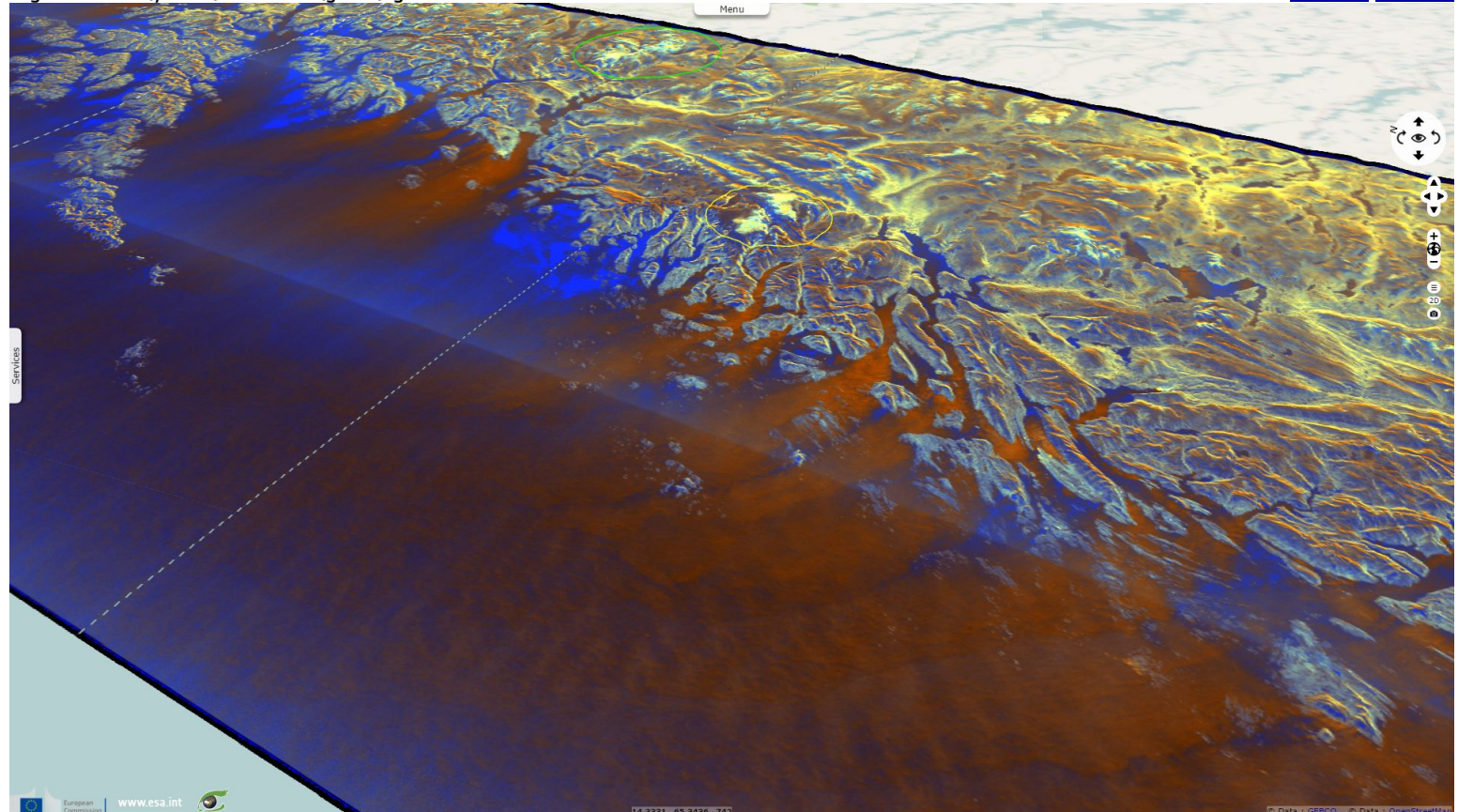


Fig. 4 - West (yellow) and East (green) glacier of Svartisen reach a total 369 km². [3D view](#) [2D view](#)



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
