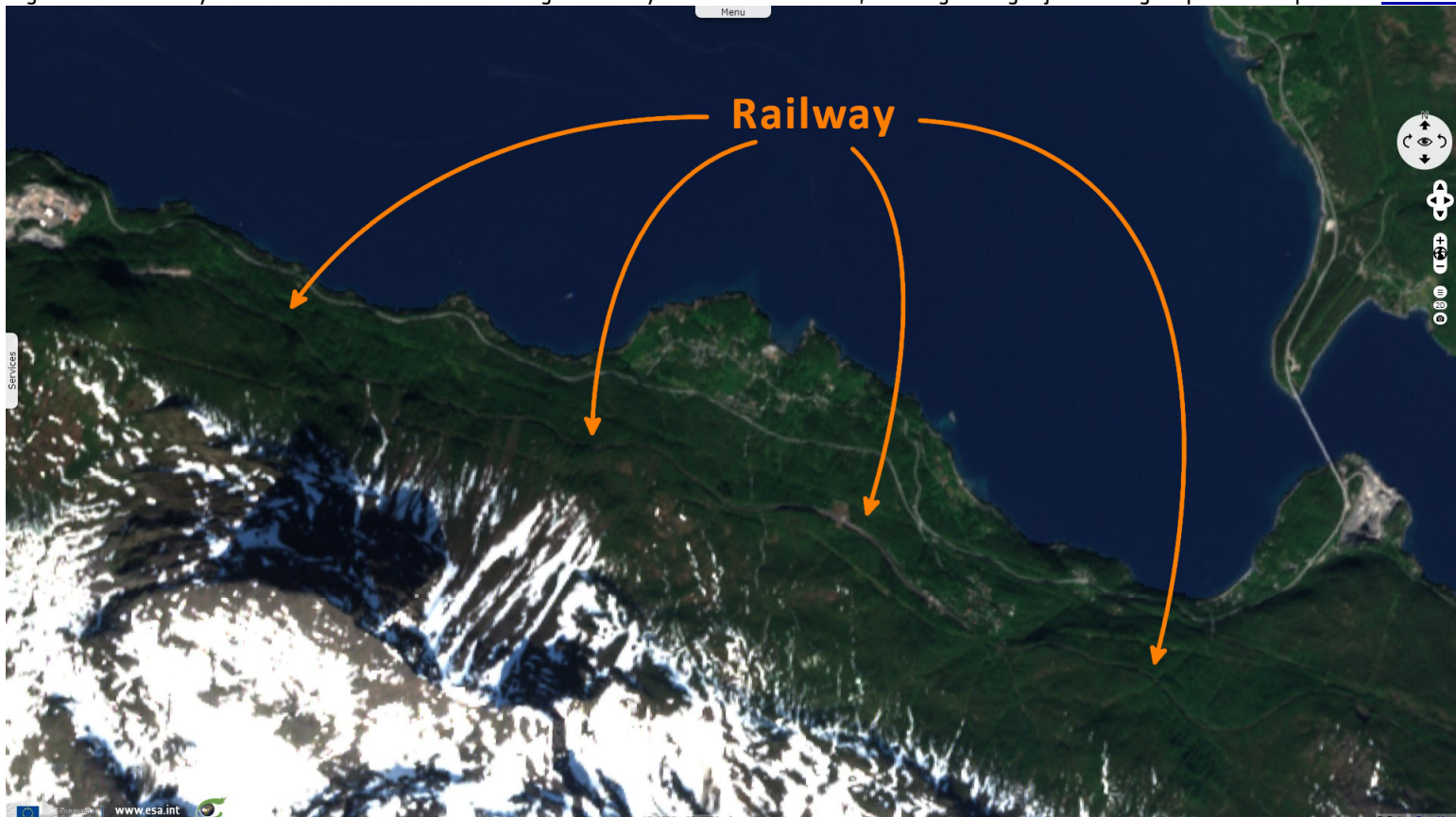
Fig. 1 - S2 (21.06.2020) - In 2020 a summer passenger service called the Arctic Train started between Narvik and Kiruna.

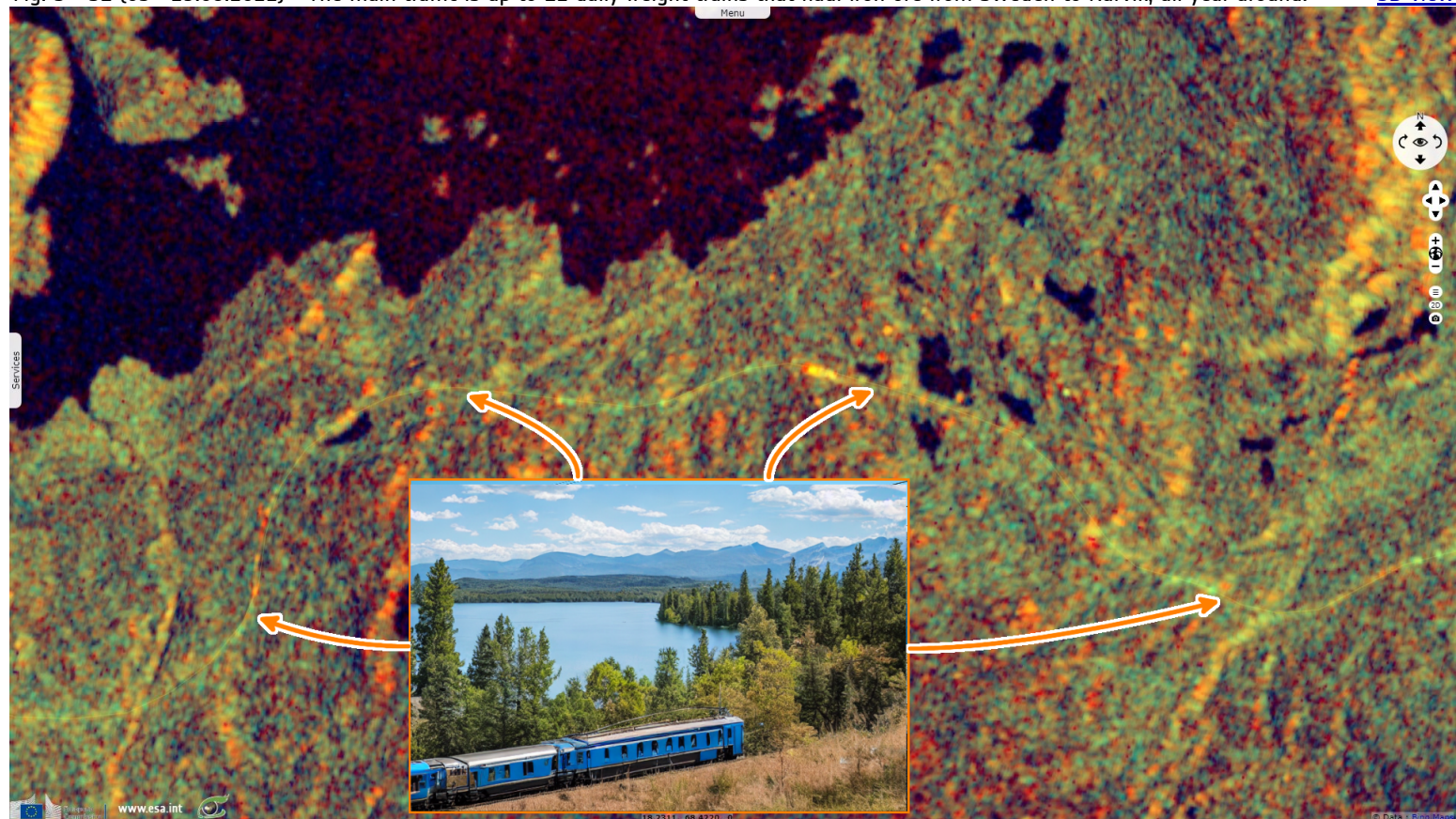
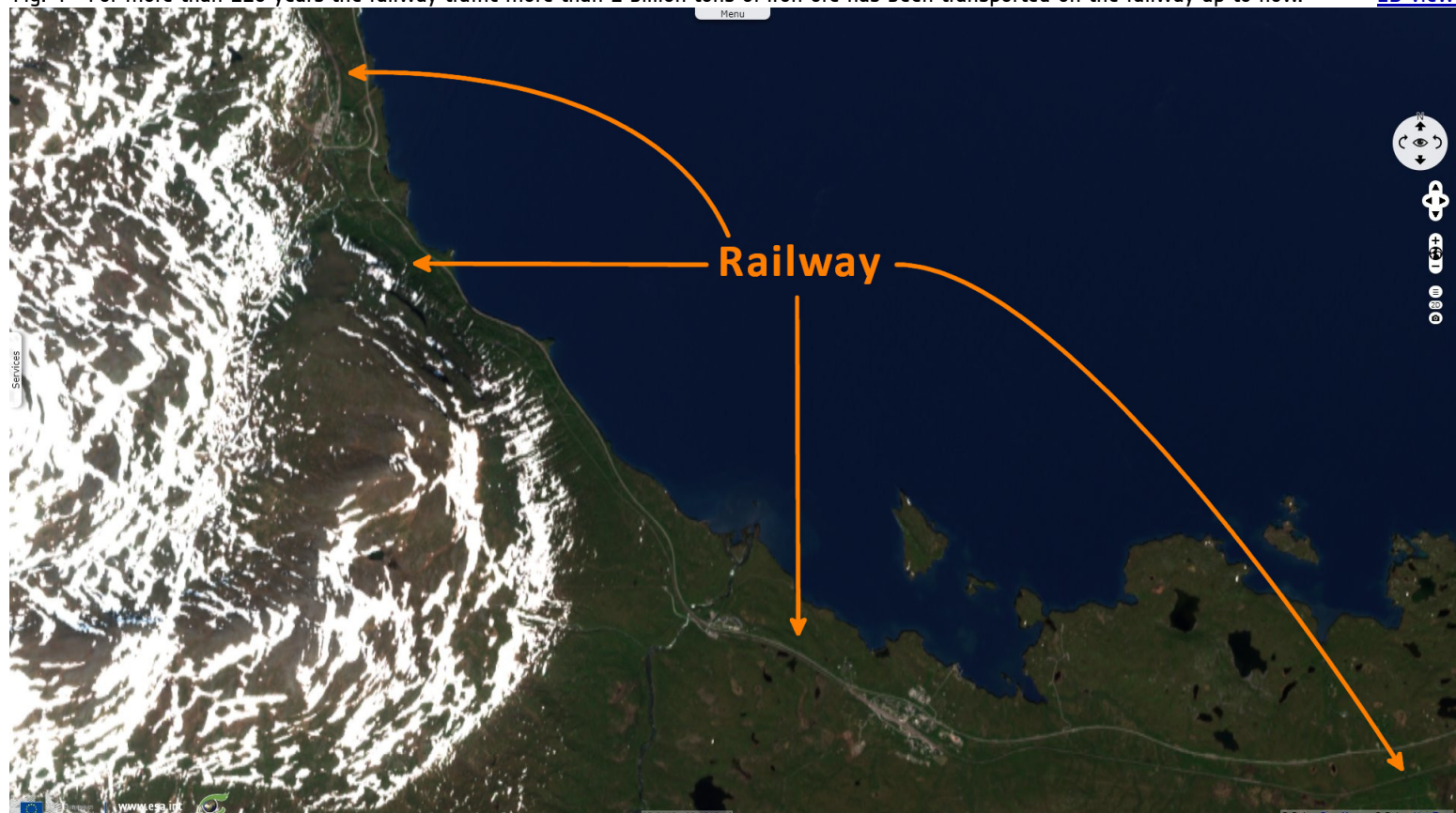














Fig. 4 - For more than 110 years the railway traffic more than 1 billion tons of iron ore has been transported on the railway up to now.
