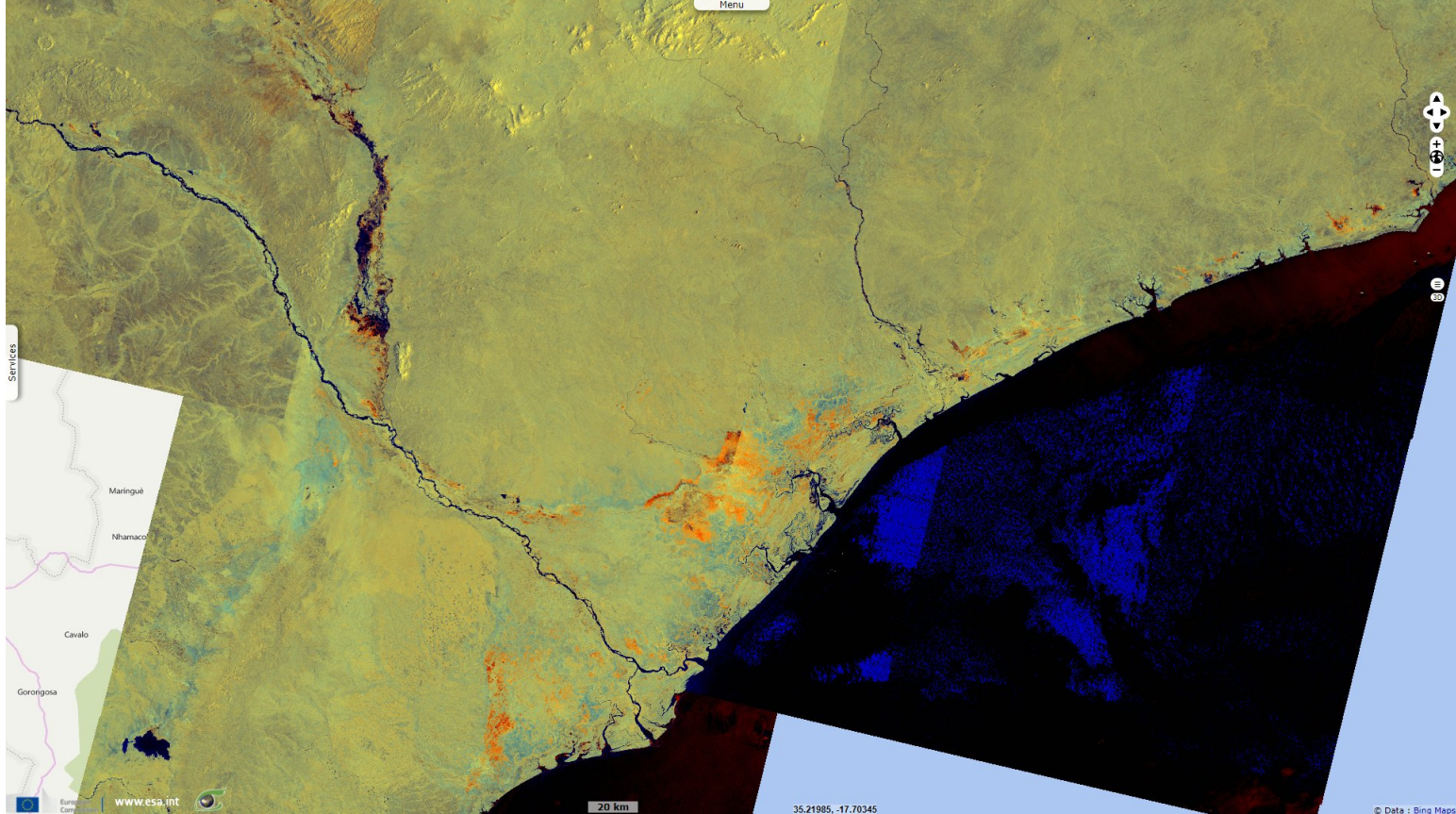


Fig. 2 - S1 (15, 17 & 22.03.2022) - Satellite imagery shows over 500 km² of land in Nampula and Zambezia provinces was under water. [2D view](#)

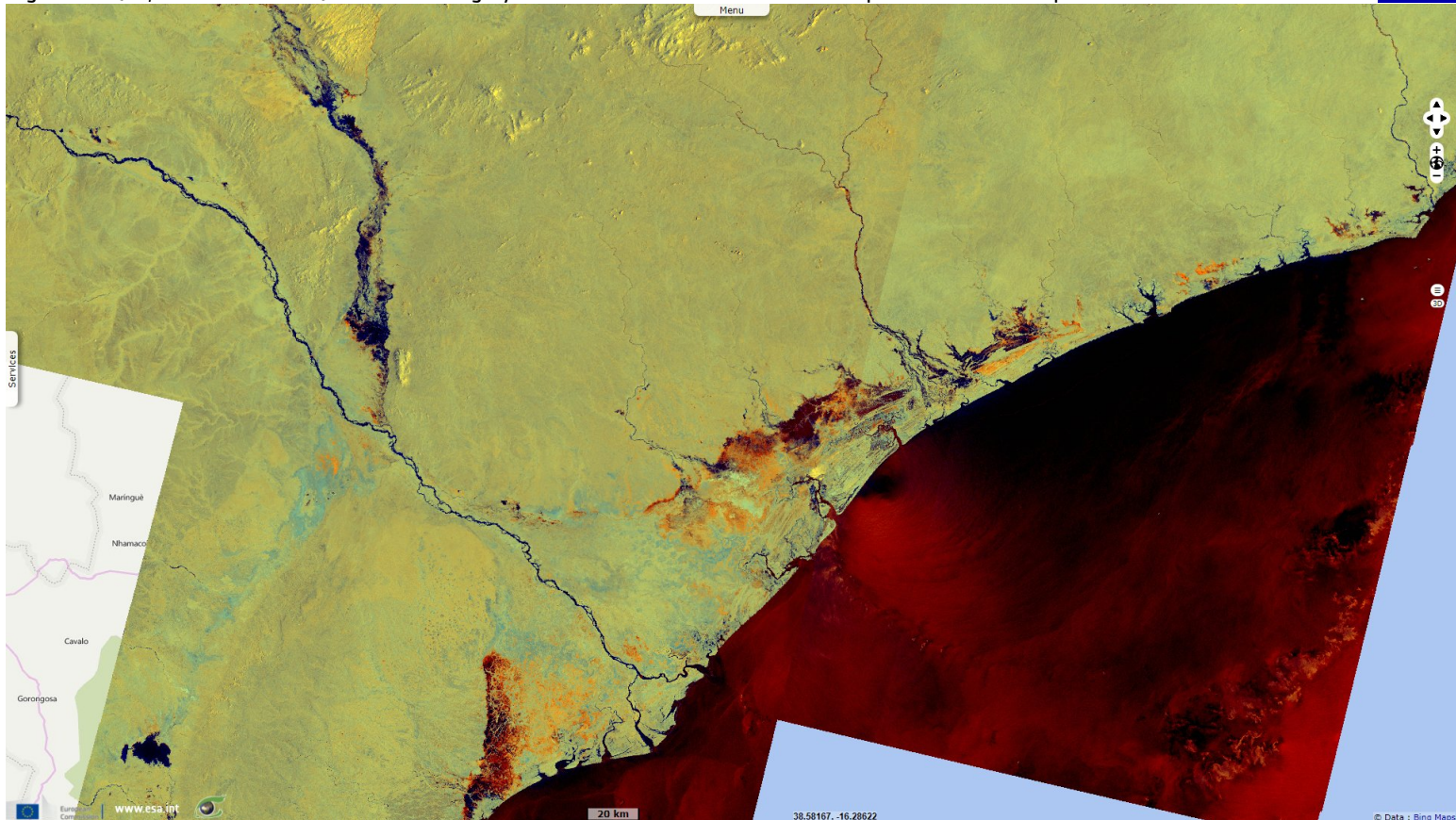


Fig. 3 - As of 18 March, the storm affected +550 000, it caused 53 deaths, injured 80 people & displaced +125 000 others. [2D animation](#) [2D view](#)

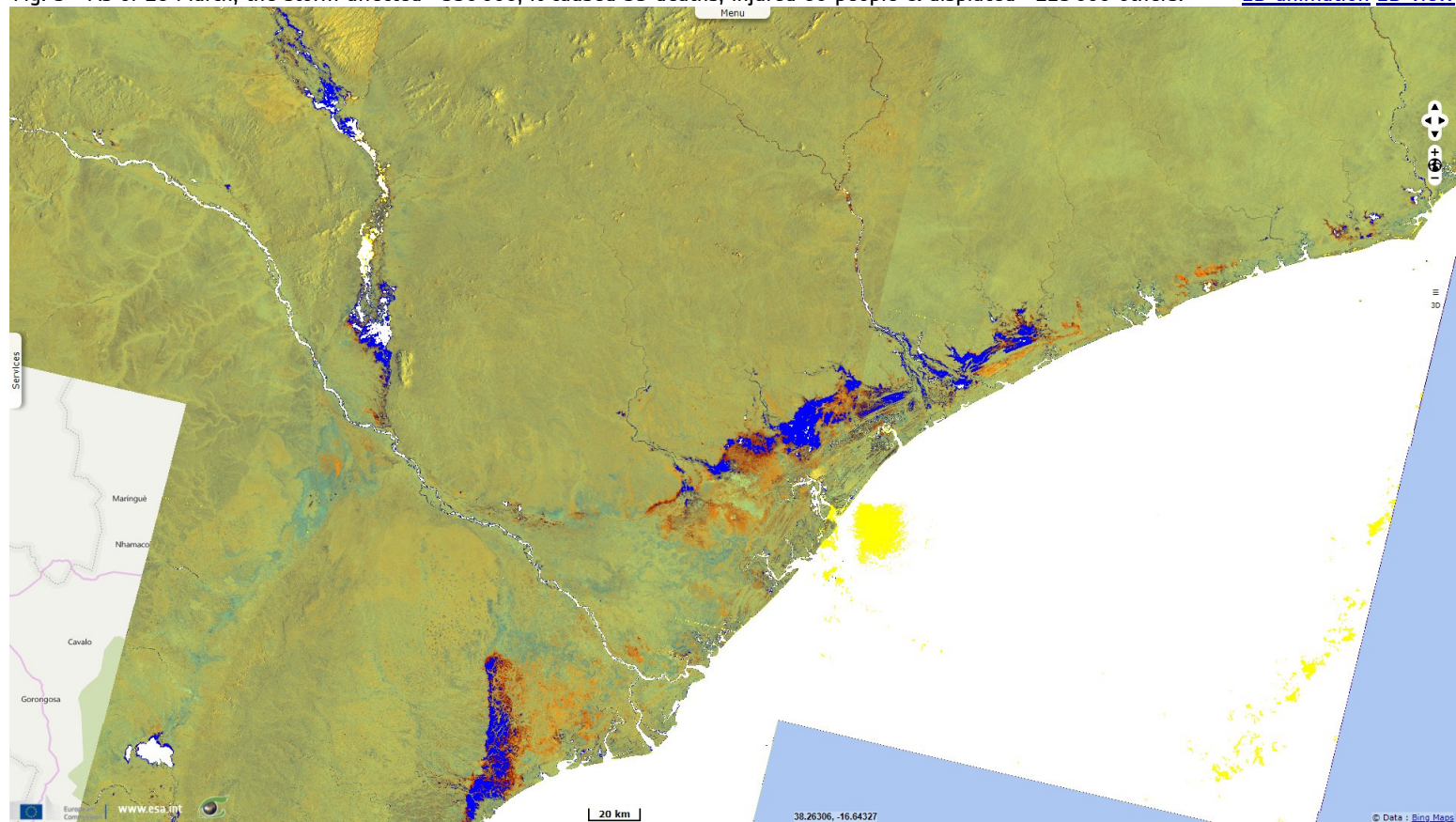
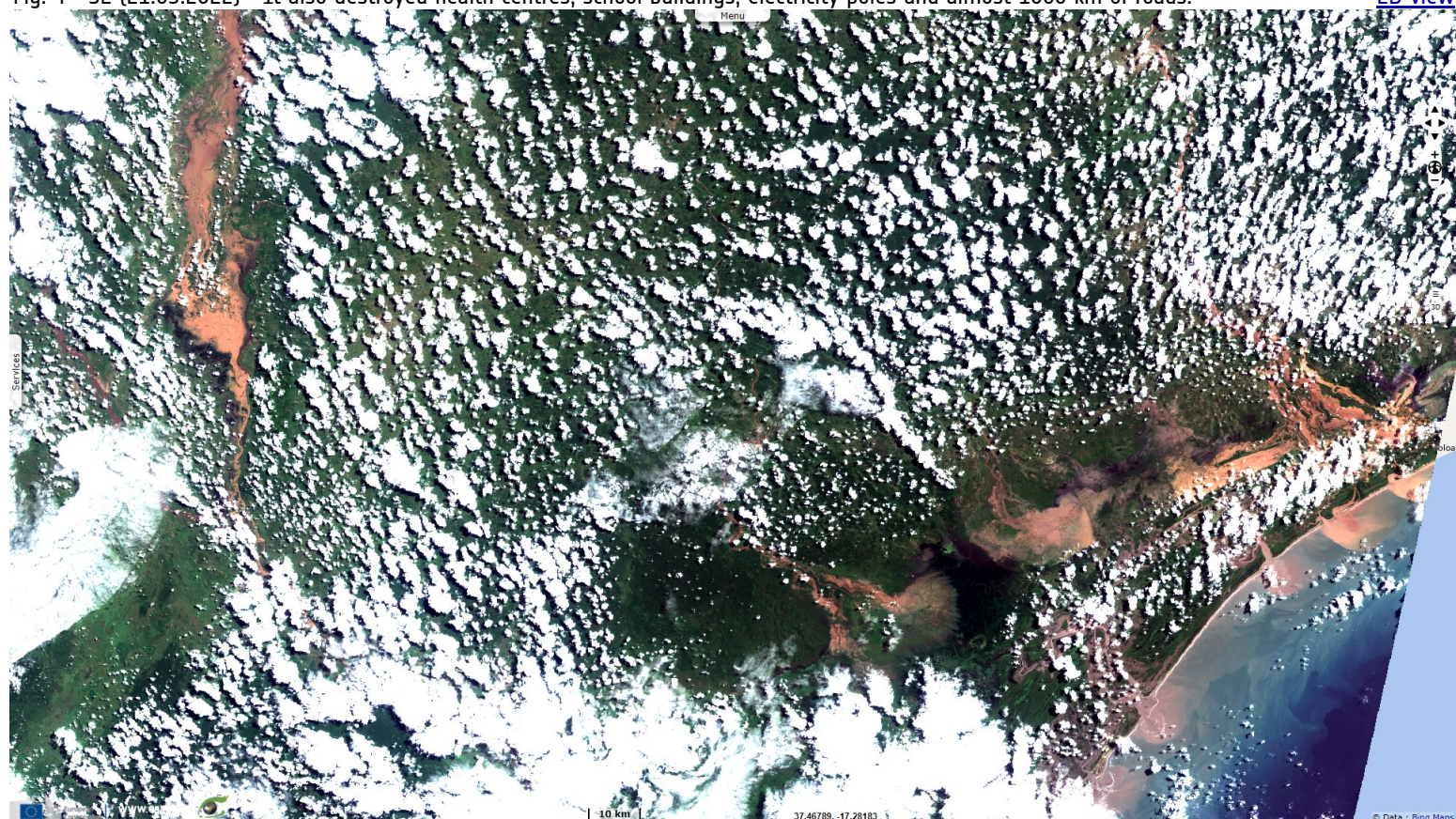


Fig. 4 - S2 (21.03.2022) - It also destroyed health centres, school buildings, electricity poles and almost 1000 km of roads. [2D view](#)



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
