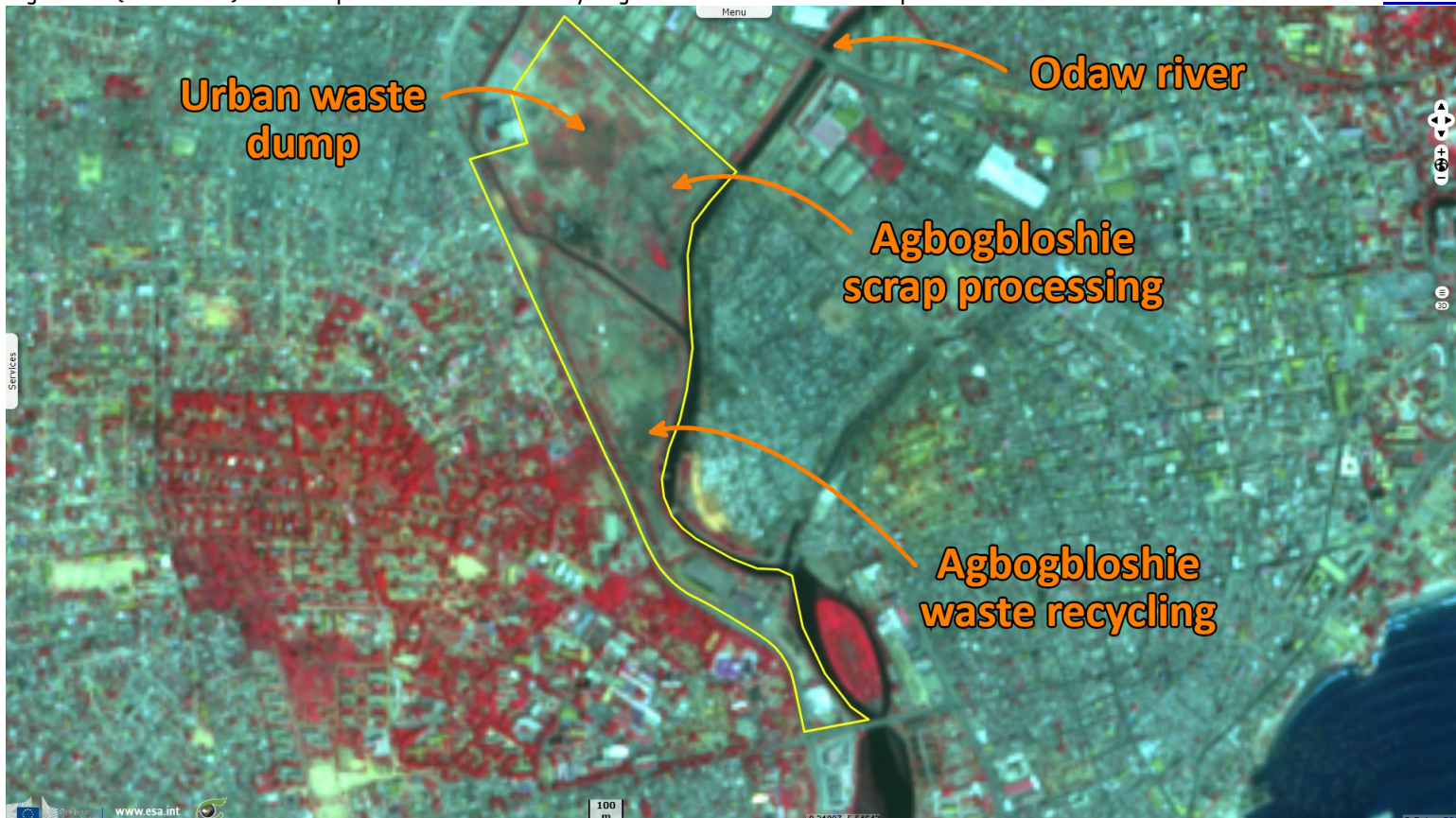
Fig. 1 - S2 (27.12.2022) - Agbogbloshie dumpsite receives electronic waste from the rest of the World.
