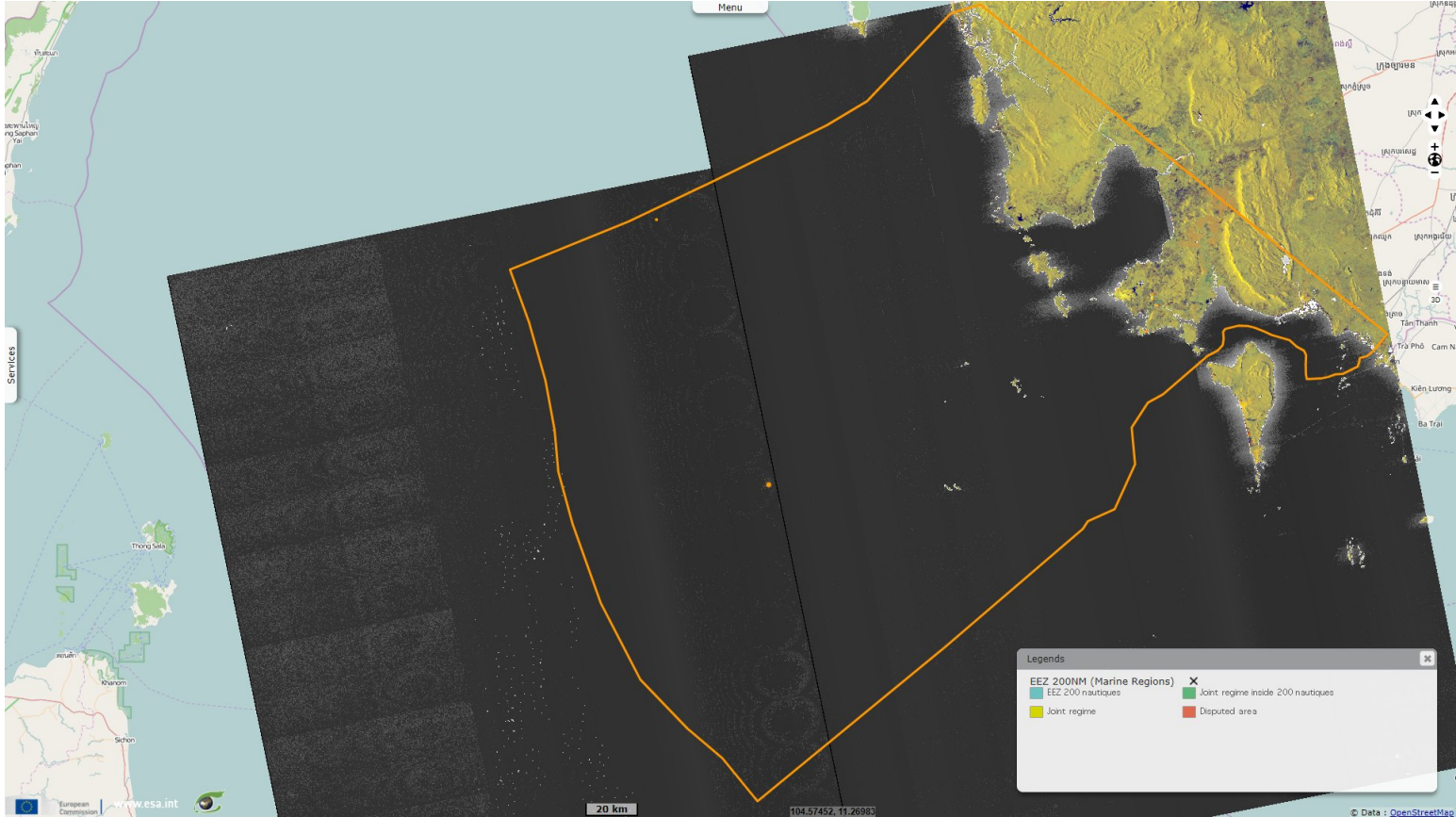


Fig. 2 - S1 (20.12.2020) - Oil has been looked for for fifteen years in Cambodia waters.

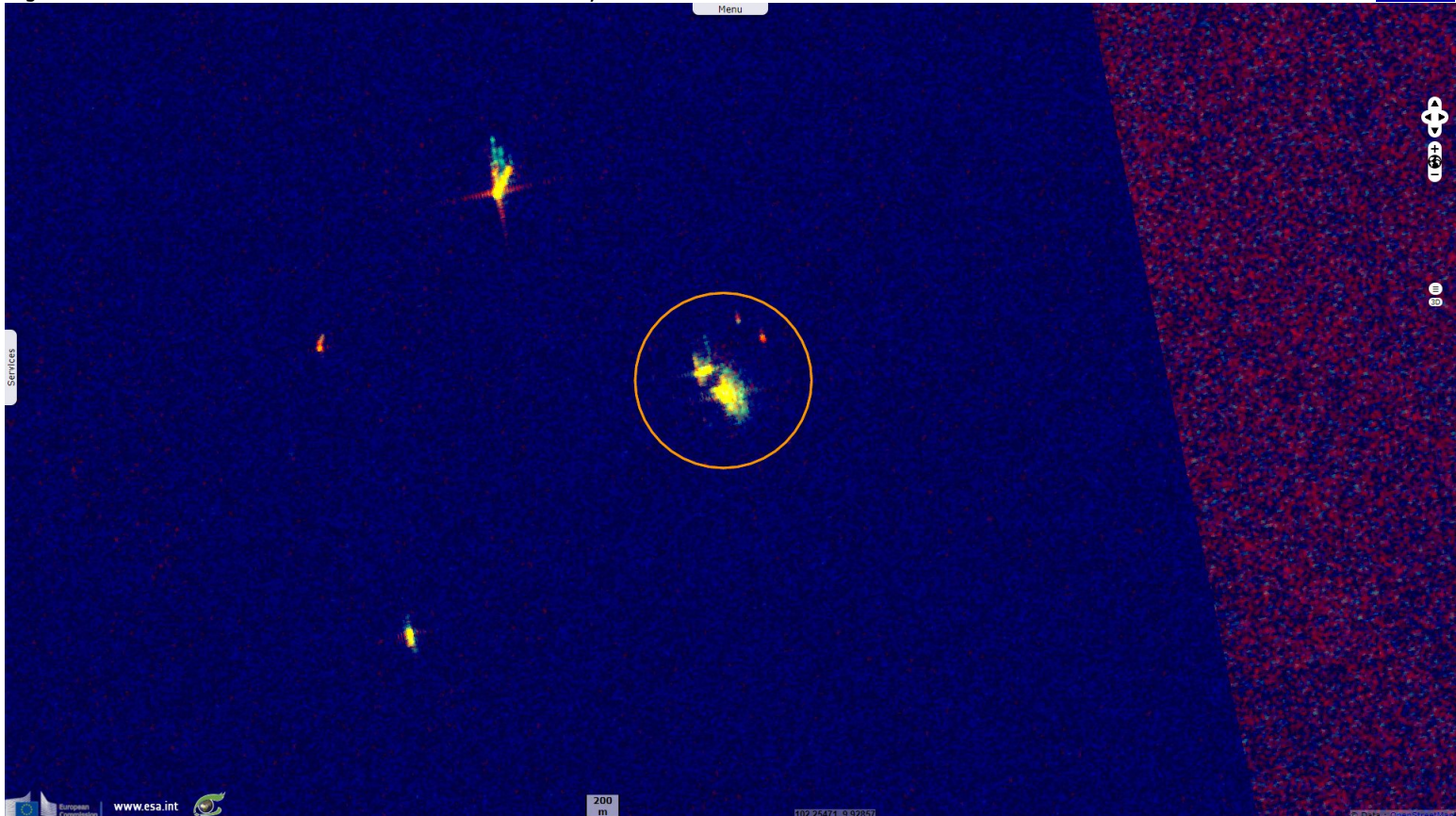


Fig. 3 - S1 (01.01.2021) - It is only on 28.12.2020 that the first drop of oil has been collected by the Singaporean company KrisEnergy. [2D view](#)

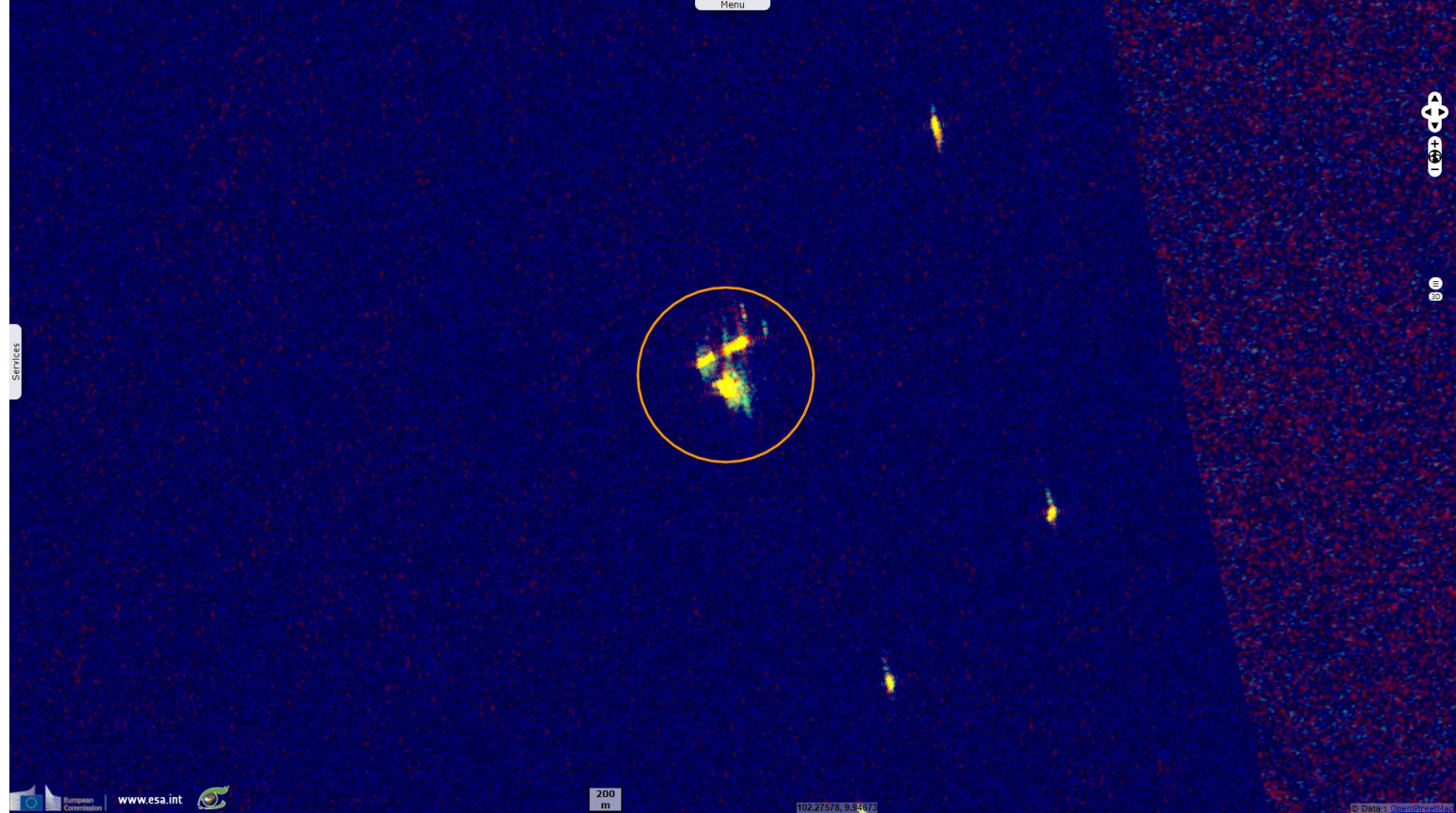
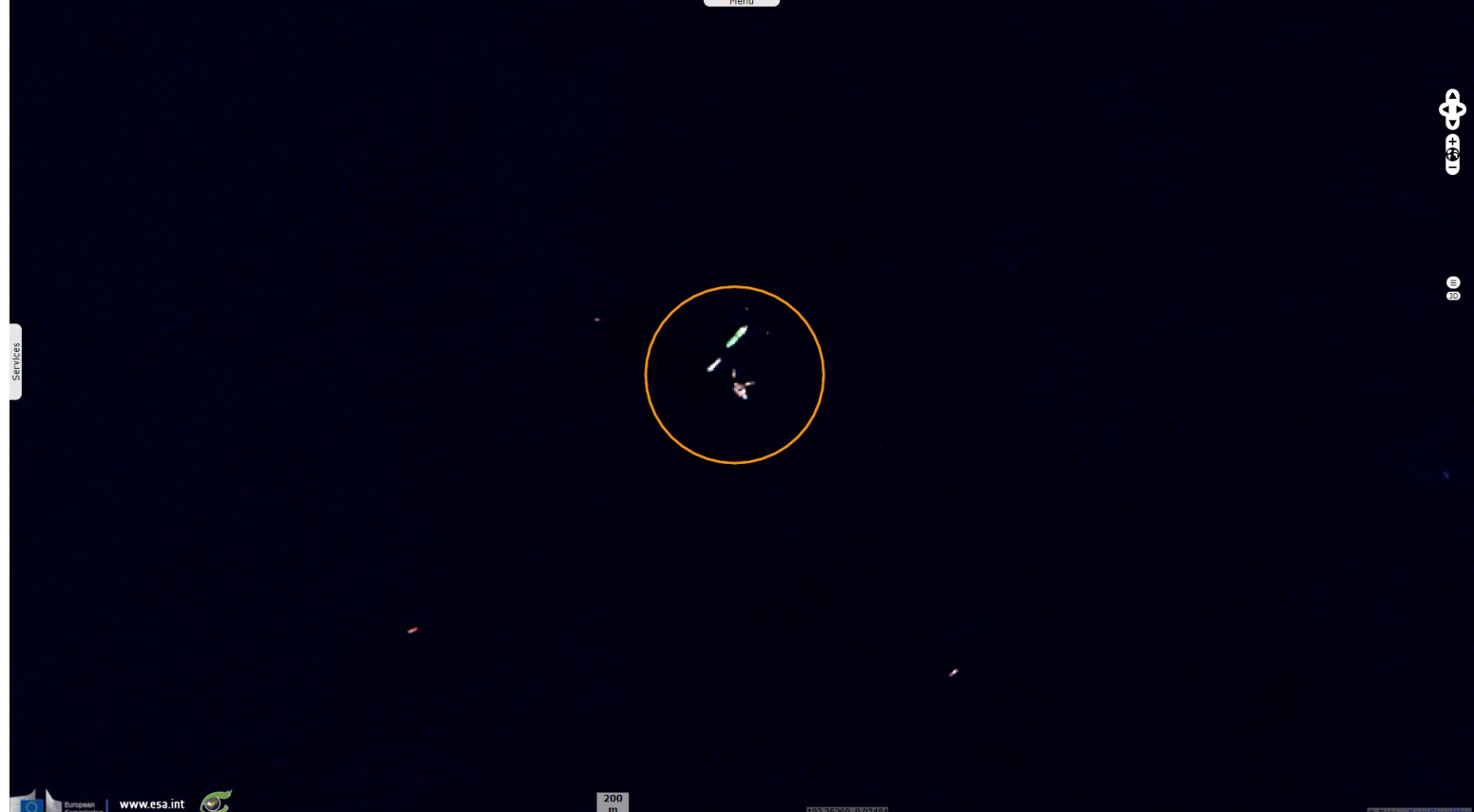














Fig. 4 - S2 (09.12.2020) - The wells are located 160 kilometers off the port of Sihanoukville, in shallow waters of the Gulf of Thailand. [2D view](#)
