





Kong was the capital of the Ouattara Empire that lasted through most of the 18th and 19th centuries. In 1897, forces of the Wassoulou Empire defeated the last forces of Kong and burnt the town to the ground. Built in a traditional baked mud Sahelian architecture style, their 17th century landmark Kong Friday Mosque survived and is protected since 1988. New infrastructures have been developed recently
