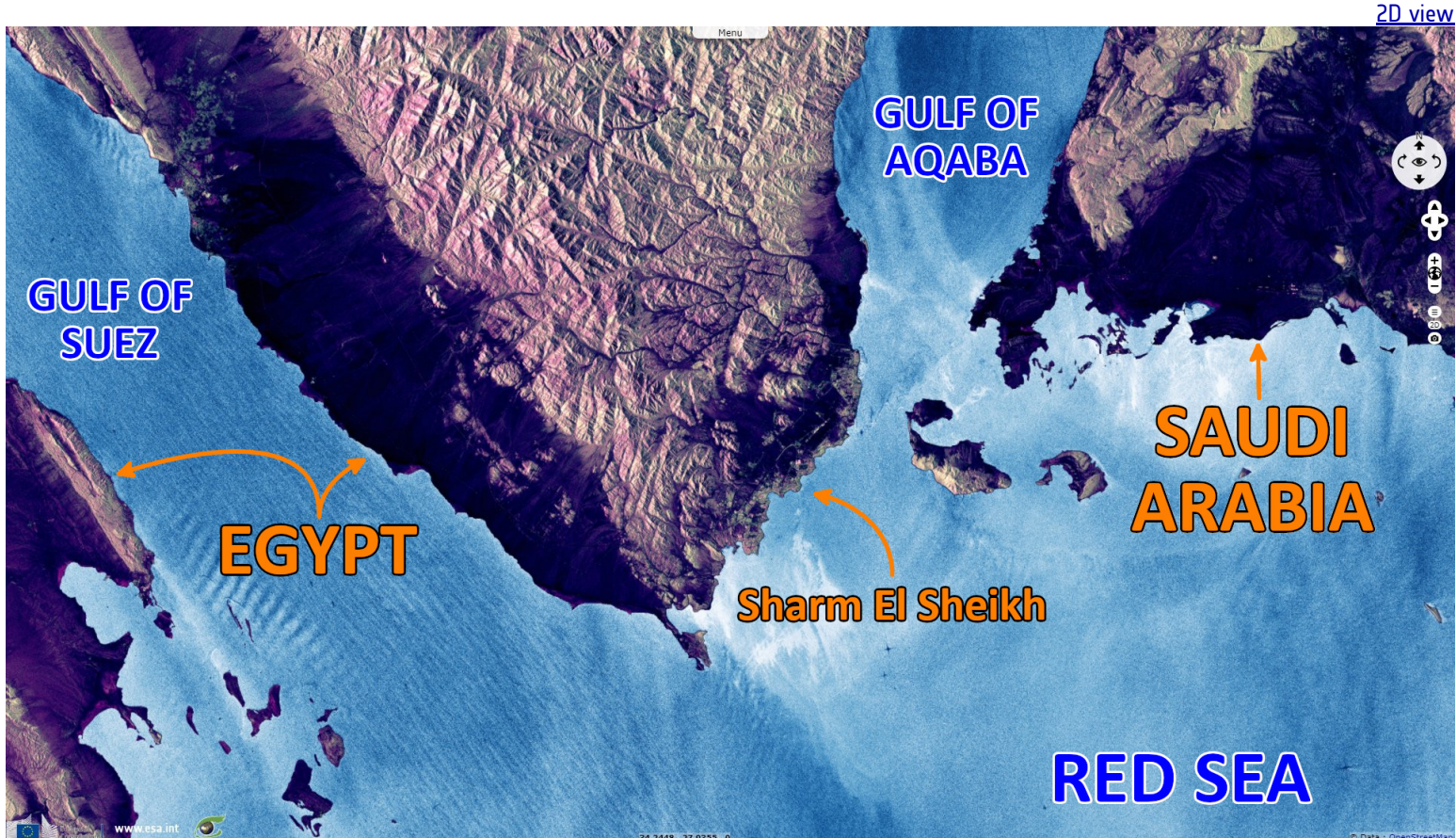

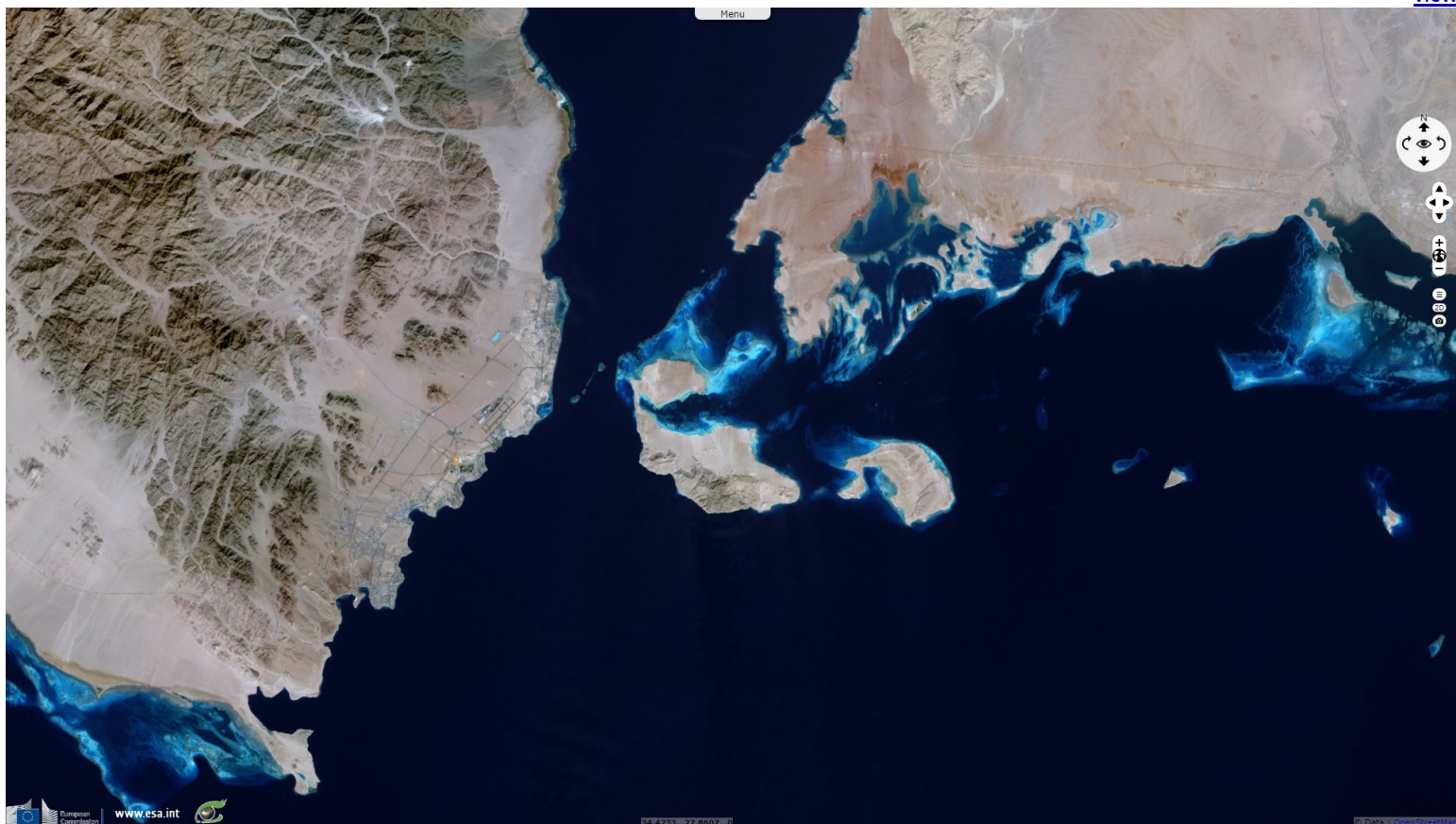


Fig. 3 - S2 (06.11.2022) - Developing country demands for a special "Loss and Damage" funds.
