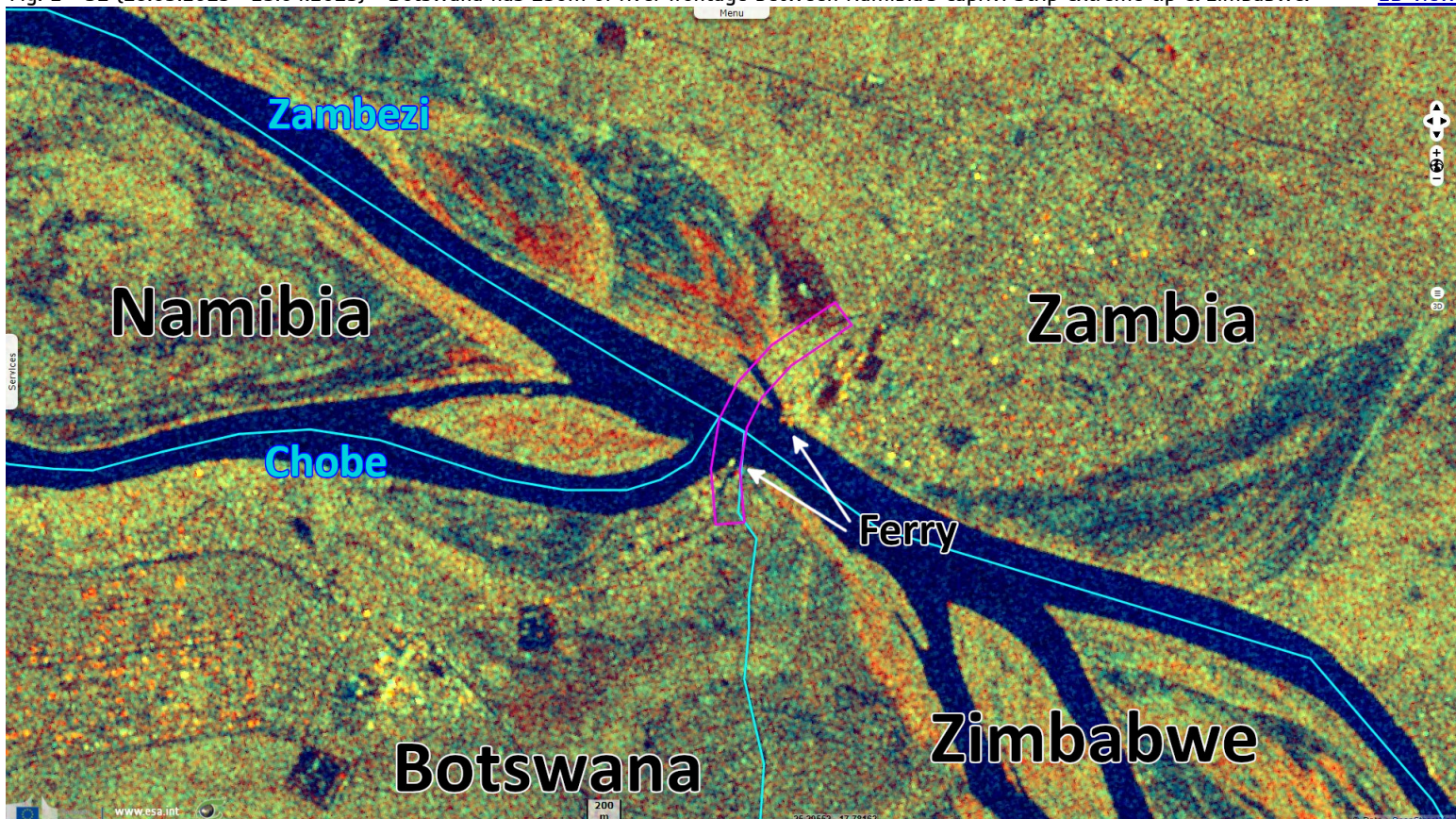


Fig. 3 - S1 (07.08.2021->12.09.2021) - The 400m wide Zambezi river used to be crossed by ferry between Kazungula in Zambia & Kazungula in Botswana.

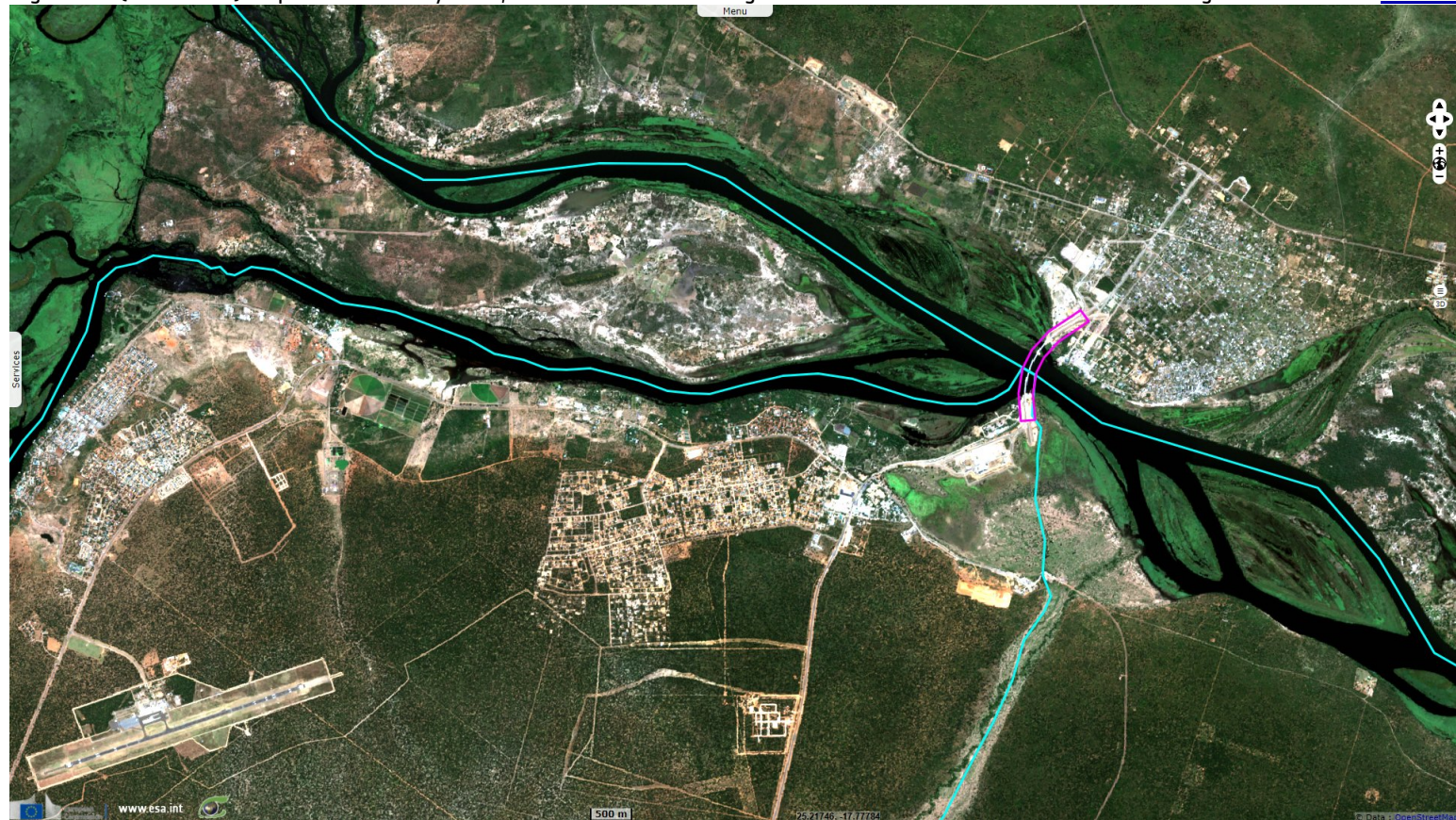


Fig. 6 - S2 (03.11.2021) - Neighbouring towns have already grown in a few months since the opening of the bridge.
