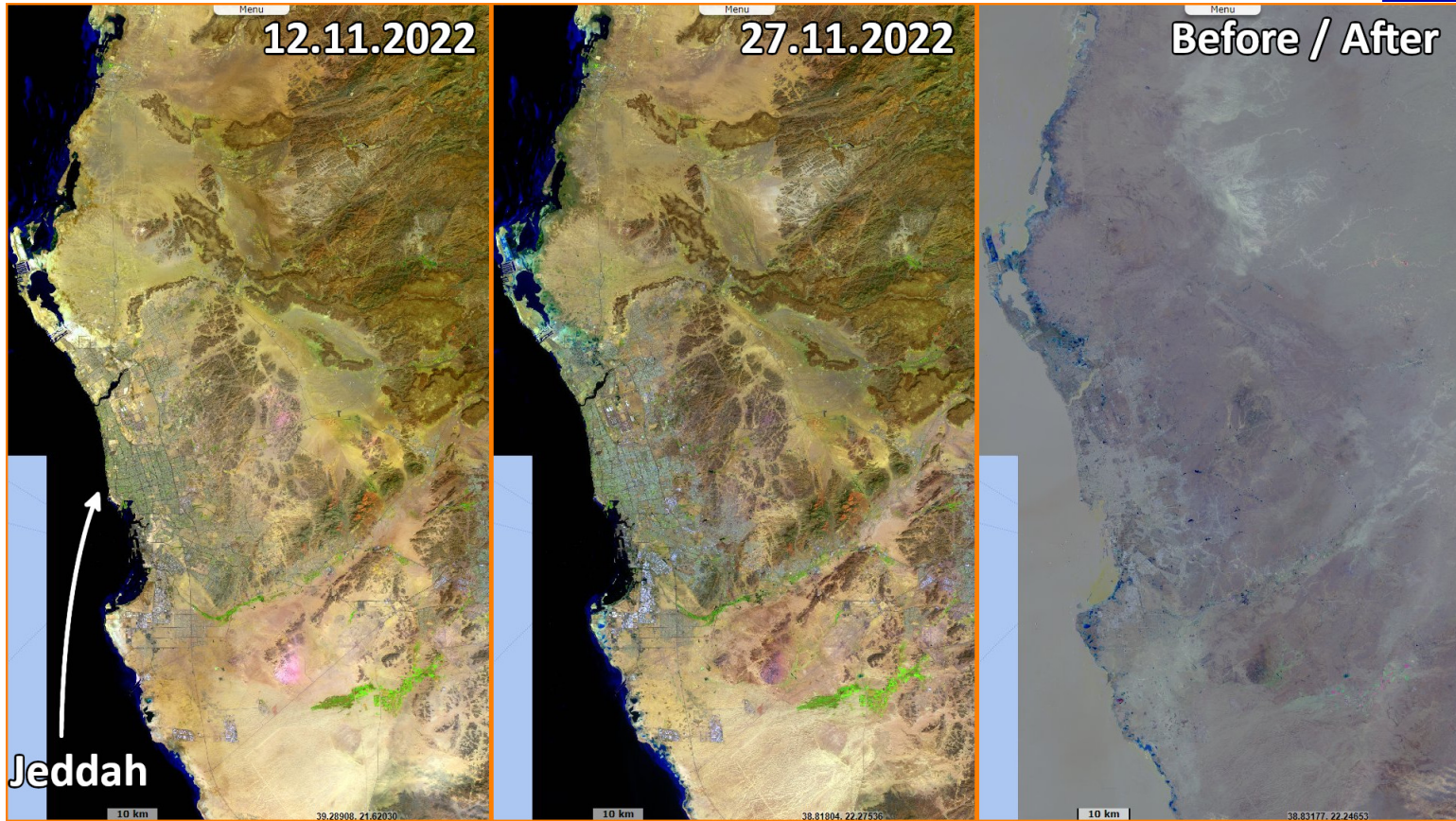


Fig. 2 - S2 (12 & 27.11.2022) - The mean total rainfall for November in the city is 23 mm. The annual mean total rainfall is 55.6 mm. [3D view](#) [2D view](#)

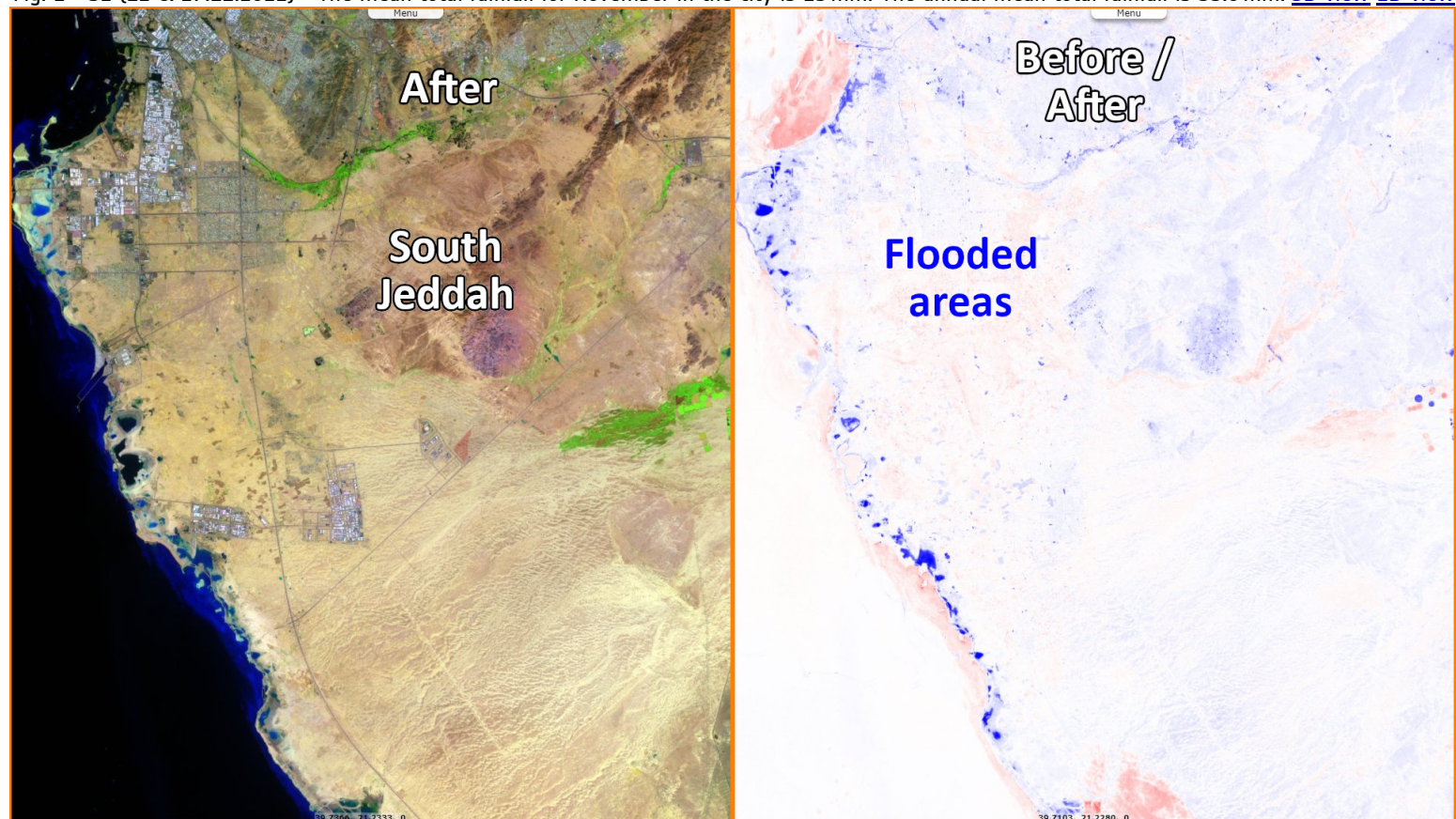


Fig. 3 - S2 (12 & 27.11.2022) - Severe flash flooding struck torrential rain on 24 November 2022; at least 2 fatalities have been reported. [2D view](#)

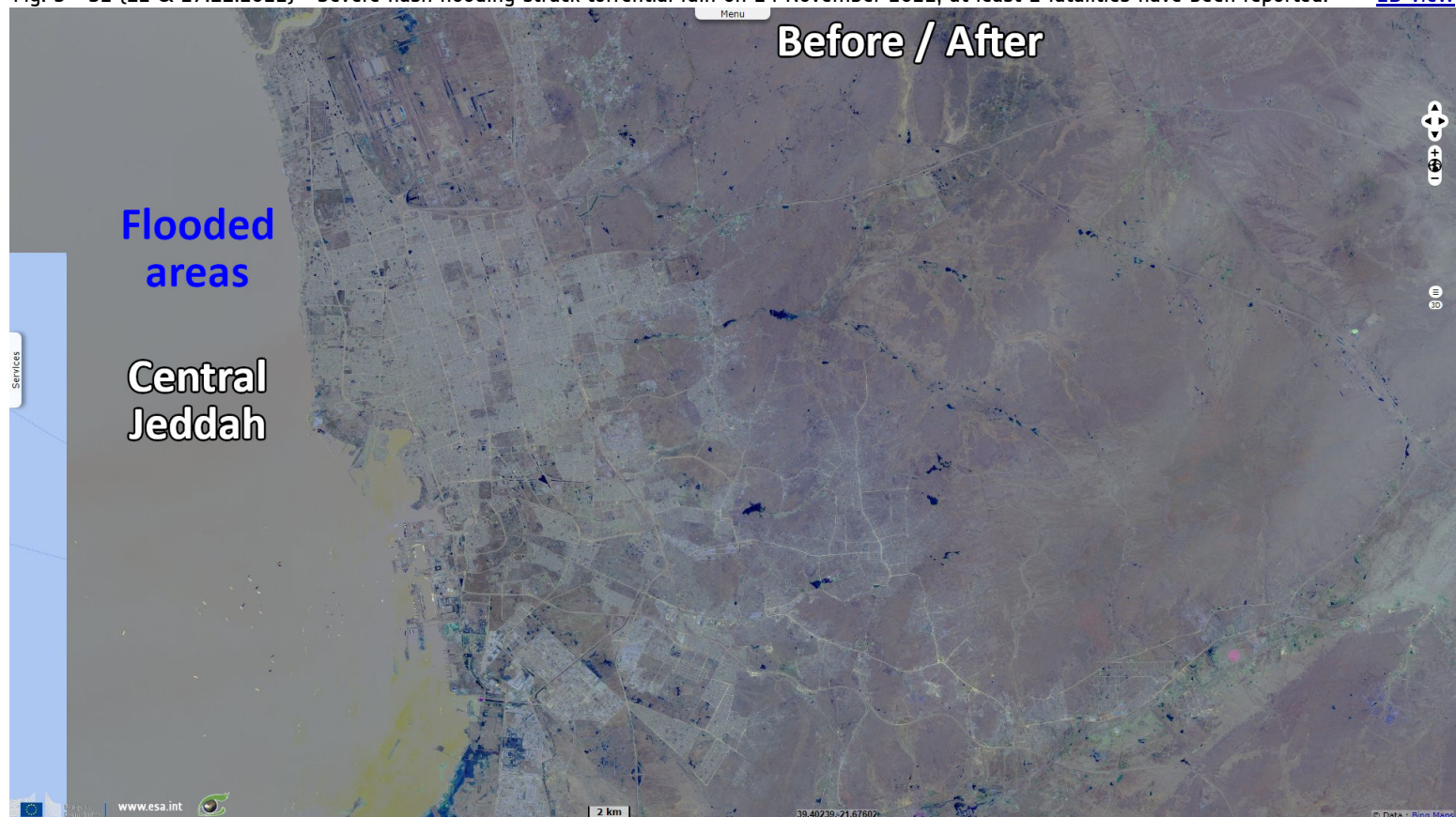
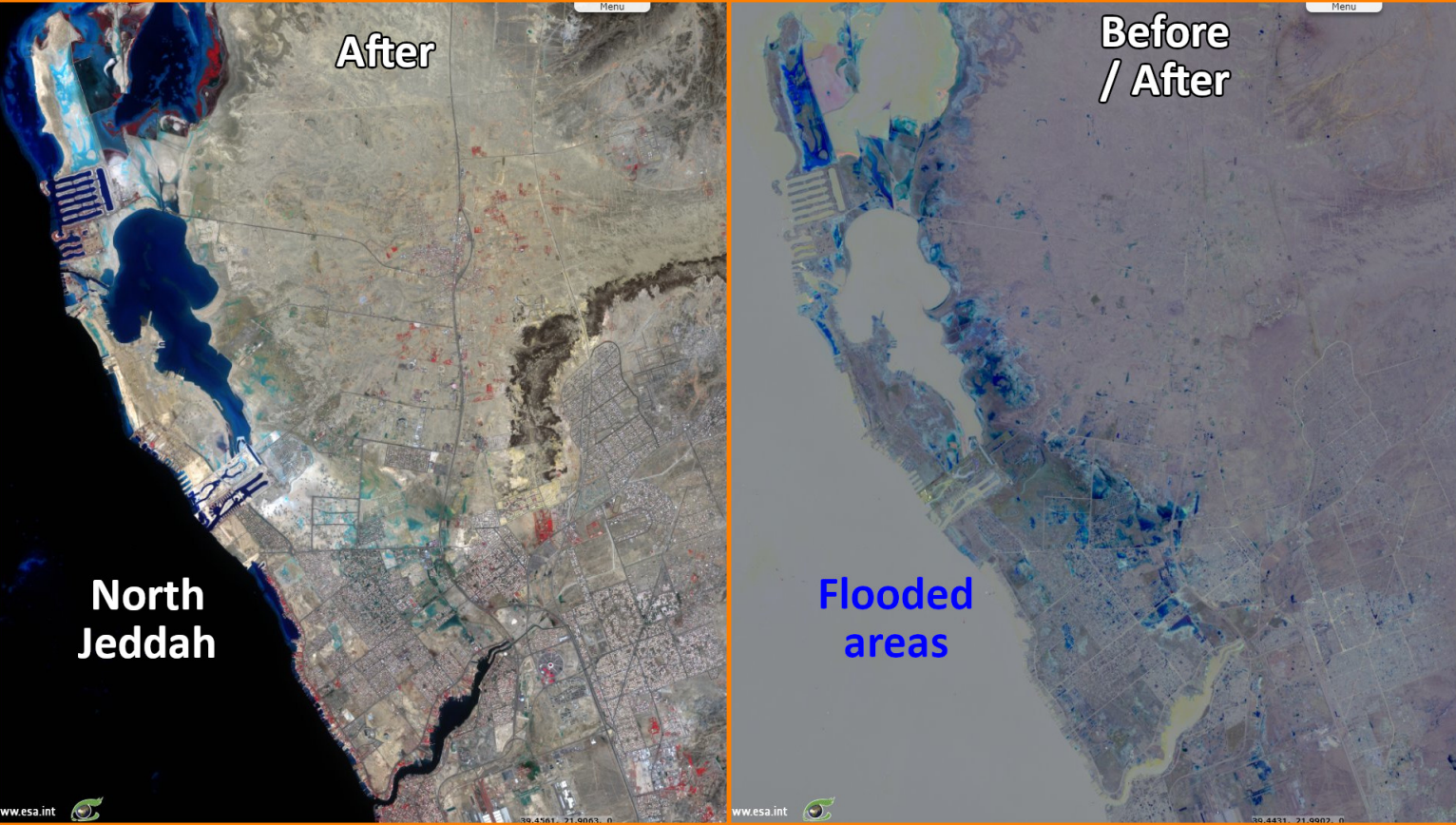


Fig. 4 - S2 (12 & 27.11.2022) - Heavy rain also affected areas of the neighbouring Medina Province.
